

I support "**DISAPPROVING** THE INDEPENDENT DEVELOPMENT OF THE LIHAU'ULA WORKFORCE HOUSING PROJECT PURSUANT TO SECTION 201H-38, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES." (The purpose of the proposed resolution is to disapprove the proposed project.)

While I agree that affordable housing is needed for Maui's residents, it is imperative that development be "smart" and sustainable - meaning we do not destroy our island while trying to pursue a life on it.

West Maui already suffers from traffic and congestion issues, the increasing threat of sea level rise, damage to Olowalu reef, and a loss of land and culture due to the gross development of this part of Maui.

The residents of these proposed homes would need to drive on the already backed up Honoapi'ilani Highway to travel to work, shopping, school, plus hospital and medical care. Adding housing that could easily result in 100 or more cars each day entering and departing from the highway in Olowalu will only compound the traffic issues and compromise safety in this area. Affordable housing should be built closer to the existing towns of Lāhaina to encourage more sustainable, car-free modes of travel.

In addition, dense housing should not be built along the Honoapi'ilani Highway between Ukumehame and Olowalu due to the frequency of coastal flooding of the highway and resulting debris overtopping of the road. With climate change and rising sea level rise, this regular flooding is occurring more frequently. This highway between Ukumehame and Olowalu is forecast to be inundated by frequent flooding by 2030, with just a projected .5 feet of sea level rise. (PacIOOS Hawaii Sea Level Rise Viewer).

For the safety of the residents of West Maui, whose access to critical infrastructure (hospital, airport, harbor and stores) when the Honoapi'ilani Highway floods, the Maui County Council and the State of Hawaii Department of Transportation needs to first finalize plans for how and where the Honoapi'ilani Highway would be moved inland before any development occurs in this corridor between the ocean and the mountains.

Pāpalaua to Olowalu is the last remaining stretch of undeveloped land between Central and West Maui, allowing a vital respite for residents who rely on the ocean for enjoyment, their livelihood, and their personal practice of spirituality, culture, and religion.

Please vote AGAINST this housing development in this fragile area.

The residents of these homes would need to drive on the already congested Honoapi'ilani Highway to travel to work, shopping, school, plus hospital and medical care. Adding housing that could easily result in 100 or more cars each day entering and departing from the highway in Olowalu will only compound the traffic issues and compromise safety in this area. Affordable housing should be built closer to the existing towns of Lahaina to encourage more sustainable, car-free modes of travel.

In addition, dense housing should not be built along the Honoapi'ilani Highway between Ukumehame and Olowalu due to the frequency of coastal flooding of the highway and resulting debris overtopping of the road. With climate change and rising sea level rise, this regular flooding is occurring more frequently. This highway between Ukumehame and Olowalu is forecast to be inundated by frequent flooding by 2030, with just a projected .5 feet of sea level rise. (PacIOOS Hawaii Sea Level Rise Viewer).

Further, the reef at Olowalu is an essential Mother Reef for islands of Maui and Lanai. A housing development in this area can only add to the potential for more urban runoff, more pollutants that are damagin to this fragile and essential area.

I DO NOT SUPPORT Lihau'ula 201H fast-track fake affordable housing project. Stated below are a few of the reasons why this is not PONO!!!

~this fast track process will allow for the EA/EIS process to be waived, avoiding important environmental review

~no long-term reliable source of water provided in application, as required.In addition, during the recent Community Plan Advisory Committee process, current landowners who purchased other property in Olowalu from this developer with the intent of farming stated not only is there insufficient water for agriculture, there isn't even enough potable water! (2/25/20 CPAC meeting materials https://wearemaui.konveio.com/past-meetings)

~sewage from 59 independent waste systems will present a significant threat to the coastal water quality of the area

~increased runoff from this area of concentrated urban development will result in increased sediment and/or other pollutant transport to the nearshore waters of Olowalu. With climate change there is increasing severity and frequency of storm events, and therefore, planning to capture only the increased run off in a 50-year event is grossly inadequate. The highest point of this proposed development is only 25' above sea level and just a few hundred yards from the coastline. Heavy runoff will result in almost direct transport of polluted runoff into the ocean.

~increased shoreline user conflicts and significant increase of the harvest of coastal resources for recreational and/or subsistence take.

~application does not acknowledge cultural practice such as fishing; the gathering of 'opihi, pipipi and limu; and the gathering of pu'ohe'ohe and 'uki'uki. In addition, ground-altering activities associated with the proposed project have the potential to impact the coastal, marine and terrestrial environment in the area.

~Office of Planning does not support such use of the 201H process to enable lots smaller than the current County twoacre minimum lot size, as it further exacerbates the problem of gentleman estate lots that inflate agricultural land value, benefit the homeowner via property tax exemptions and lower water rates, while providing no viable agricultural production on agricultural land, and generally reducing land available for farming and making it more expensive for farmers.

"this landowner was denied approval by the Land Use Commission(LUC) in 2015 trying to change 320 acres of this very same agriculture land to urban/rural and now seeks to circumvent the process by "parceling" project starting with these proposed 59 lots on 27 acres. "The parcelization of the project site also raises questions as to the development plans for the surrounding lands and whether they too will be sized just under the 15-acre statutory threshold in future applications to avoid LUC scrutiny"

~appears that the planned .69-acre neighborhood park is not included within the area of the proposed boundary amendment. The park should be included within the area of the proposed boundary amendment...as it is an integral component of Lihau'ula that is intended to serve its residents. As you know, the inclusion of the park would subject the boundary amendment to the approval of the LUC as the project site would then be over the 15-acre statutory threshold..."

My name is Tom Blackburn-Rodriguez, I live in Kihei and I am testifying on behalf of Go Maui Inc. I am testifying on item AH-17.

Go Maui is a volunteer nonpartisan organization focusing its efforts on housing, jobs, water, agriculture, economic opportunity, infrastructure, energy conservation, and environmental stewardship.

We are pleased to announce that Mercer "Chubby" Vicens and Wendy Rice Peterson have joined our organization to head "The Friends of Go Maui." For more information go to <u>www.GoMauilnc.org</u>.

A few things to note about this project:

1. It is being independently funded by the developers without any County grant money. Aloha Members of the Affordable Housing Committee of the Maui County Council,

Please DISAPPROVE the Independent development of the Lihau'ula Workforce Housing project pursuant to Section 201H-38, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

Maui Nui Marine Resource Council supports affordable and workplace housing in areas where such housing can be clustered in and around an existing town, providing easy access to essential services, schools, medical facilities, and stores, thereby reducing traffic on the already congested Honoapi'ilani Highway, much of which is located close to or at current sea level. During high tides and storms, the highway is not passable. Thus it would be extremely irresponsible for Maui County to even consider permitting the building of more homes in that area.

This proposed development, named Lihau'ula, would result in the construction of 40 homes and the sale of 19 lots for additional home construction. The Lihau'ula development is described as "workforce housing" but 70% of the homes will be priced at over \$600,000 - requiring proof of income of over \$100,000 per year to qualify. This proposed price point does not address the needs of low income individuals or families - and it doesn't include the cost of maintaining a septic system in each home.

Another major concern of building homes in this area is the lack of a waste water treatment facility. Each home would need an individual septic systems or Aeration Treatment Units (ATUs). Unfortunately, ATUs require costly maintenance – another expense that the low income homeowner would need to bear. Failure to maintain these complex units results in them becoming a basic septic system that would be harmful to the reef - as fluid runs downhill. (Septic systems in South Maui are good examples of the negative impact to coastal waters)

The result of using a septic system or ATU will be more nitrogen leaching into the nearshore waters of Olowalu. Excess nitrogen in these ocean waters will be harmful to the Olowalu reef, causing overgrowth of invasive algae that blocks the sunlight that the corals need to produce food for themselves. Also, the addition of fertilizers, pesticides and herbicides associated with home landscaping, can further contaminate and stress the reef.

There is plenty of evidence that water and sediment naturally flow downhill into Maui's coastal waters where they impact the coral reefs, which protect coastal areas from storm waves and provide habitat for fish and other marine life. Clearing and building on 30 acres of land mauka of the Olowalu reef track will bring sediment to the coastal waters where it smothers the coral and and most likely kills the reef. This is well documented through observation after storms - and in the scientific literature.

For all of the reasons cited above, and those others have provided, I oppose the proposed Lihau'ula development in Olowalu.

My name is Lipoa Kahaleuahi and I oppose the Lihau'ula 201H Fast-Track Affordable Housing Project. There is very little that is affordable about this project, and rather will cause extremely environmental degradation as well as long term economic issues if passed.

Olowalu is one of the last remaining, mostly intact coastal reef ecosystems left on Maui. Since the pandemic and the decrease in traffic to these areas, there has been a recognizable increase in visibility and natural resource activity to this area. However, sewage from 59 independent waste systems will present a significant threat to the coastal water quality of the area, which remains a place for recreation for locals and visitors alike, as well as a gathering ground of food. Increased runoff from this area of concentrated urban development will also result in increased sediment and other pollutant transport to the nearshore waters of Olowalu. The application blatantly does not address the cultural practices that occur there, which raises more alarm for the necessity of a thorough EIS.

In the long term, these environmental issues will result in impacts to our economy, as continued infrastructure that could have been avoided would be necessary to deal with the waste, the lack of food sources, as well as cultural and traditional impacts made by yet another gathering place being contaminated by the excess already described above.

Despite what we may believe our county needs in the short term to outweigh the economic effects brought on by the coronavirus pandemic, one of the biggest lessons we should be learning is that our solutions should have a more long-term vision and goal. This is not the time to neglect environmental impacts. This is not the time for fast-track development just to make a quick buck. This is the time to harness the mistakes made in years past to shape a better future.
