THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into by and between the STATE OF HAWAII by and through its Director of Transportation, hereinafter referred to as "State," and the Governmental Unit named in this application, hereinafter referred to as "Applicant."

WHEREAS, the National Highway Safety Act of 1966 (Public Law 89-564) provides Federal funds to the STATE for approved highway safety projects, and

WHEREAS, STATE may make said funds available to various state, county or municipal agencies or governments or political subdivisions upon application and approval by STATE and the UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, and

WHEREAS, STATE is obligated to reimburse the UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION out of its funds for any ineligible or unauthorized expenditures for which Federal funds have been claimed and payment received, and

WHEREAS, the above name APPLICANT has submitted an application for Federal funds for highway safety projects.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF MUTUAL PROMISES AND OTHER GOOD AND VALUABLE CONSIDERATION, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

The APPLICANT will comply with applicable statutes and regulations, including but not limited to:

- •23 U.S.C. Chapter 4 Highway Safety Act of 1966, as amended
- •Sec. 1906, Pub. L. 109-59, as amended by Sec. 4011, Pub. L. 114-94
- •23 CFR part 1300 Uniform Procedures for State Highway Safety Grant Programs
- •2 CFR part 200 Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards
- •2 CFR part 1201 Department of Transportation, Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards

NONDISCRIMINATION

The APPLICANT will comply with all Federal statutes and implementing regulations relating to nondiscrimination ("Federal Nondiscrimination Authorities"). These include but are not limited to:

- •Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 2000d et seq., 78 stat. 252), (prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin) and 49 CFR part 21;
- •The Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, (42 U.S.C. 4601), (prohibits unfair treatment of persons displaced or whose property has been acquired because of Federal or Federal-aid programs and projects);
- •Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1973, (23 U.S.C. 324 et seq.), and Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended (20 U.S.C. 1681-1683 and 1685-1686) (prohibit discrimination on the basis of sex);
- •Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, (29 U.S.C. 794 et seq.), as amended, (prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability) and 49 CFR part 27;
- •The Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended, (42 U.S.C. 6101 et seq.), (prohibits discrimination on the basis of age);
- •The Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, (Pub. L. 100-209), (broadens scope, coverage and applicability of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, The Age Discrimination Act of 1975 and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, by expanding the definition of the terms "programs or activities" to include all of the programs or activities of the Federal aid recipients, subrecipients and contractors, whether such programs or activities are Federally-funded or not);
- •Titles II and III of the Americans with Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. 12131-12189) (prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability in the operation of public entities, public and private transportation systems, places of public accommodation, and certain testing) and 49 CFR parts 37 and 38;
- •Executive Order 12898, Federal Actions to Address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low-Income Populations (prevents discrimination against minority populations by discouraging programs, policies, and activities with disproportionately high and adverse human health or environmental effects on minority and low-income populations); and
- •Executive Order 13166, Improving Access to Services for Persons with Limited English Proficiency (guards against Title VI national origin discrimination/discrimination because of limited English proficiency (LEP) by ensuring that funding recipients take reasonable steps to ensure that LEP persons have meaningful access to programs (70 FR 74087-74100).

The State highway safety agency—

- •Will take all measures necessary to ensure that no person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color, national origin, disability, sex, age, limited English proficiency, or membership in any other class protected by Federal Nondiscrimination Authorities, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any of its programs or activities, so long as any portion of the program is Federally-assisted;
- •Will administer the program in a manner that reasonably ensures that any of its subrecipients, contractors, subcontractors, and consultants receiving Federal financial assistance under this program will comply with all requirements of the Non-Discrimination Authorities identified in this Assurance;
- •Agrees to comply (and require its subrecipients, contractors, subcontractors, and consultants to comply) with all applicable provisions of law or regulation governing US DOT's or NHTSA's access to records, accounts, documents, information, facilities, and staff, and to cooperate and comply with any program or compliance reviews, and/or complaint investigations conducted by US DOT or NHTSA under any Federal Nondiscrimination Authority;
- •Acknowledges that the United States has a right to seek judicial enforcement with regard to any matter arising under these Non-Discrimination Authorities and this Assurance;
- •Agrees to insert in all contracts and funding agreements with other State or private entities the following clause:
- "During the performance of this contract/funding agreement, the contractor/funding recipient agrees-
- a. To comply with all Federal nondiscrimination laws and regulations, as may be amended from time to time;
- b. Not to participate directly or indirectly in the discrimination prohibited by any Federal nondiscrimination law or regulation, as set forth in appendix B of 49 CFR part 21 and herein;
- c.To permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and its facilities as required by the State highway safety office, US DOT or NHTSA;
- d. That, in event a contractor/funding recipient fails to comply with any nondiscrimination provisions in this contract/funding agreement, the State highway safety agency will have the right to impose such contract/agreement sanctions as it or NHTSA determine are appropriate, including but not limited to withholding payments to the contractor/funding recipient under the contract/agreement until the contractor/funding recipient complies; and/or cancelling, terminating, or suspending a contract or funding agreement, in whole or in part; and
- e. To insert this clause, including paragraphs (a) through (e), in every subcontract and subagreement and in every solicitation for a subcontract or sub-agreement, that receives Federal funds under this program.

POLITICAL ACTIVITY (HATCH ACT)

The APPLICANT will comply with provisions of the Hatch Act (5 U.S.C. 1501-1508), which limits the political activities of employees whose principal employment activities are funded in whole or in part with Federal funds.

CERTIFICATION REGARDING FEDERAL LOBBYING

Certification for Contracts, Grants, Loans, and Cooperative Agreements. The undersigned certifies, to the best of his or her knowledge and belief, that:

- 1. No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the undersigned, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any Federal grant, the making of any Federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement;

The undersigned shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award documents for all sub-award at all tiers (including subcontracts, subgrants, and contracts under grant, loans, and cooperative agreements) and that all subrecipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.

This certification is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when this transaction was made or entered into. Submission of this certification is a prerequisite for making or entering into this transaction imposed by section 1352, title 31, U.S. Code. Any person who fails to file the required certification shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$100,000 for each such failure.

RESTRICTION ON STATE LOBBYING

None of the funds under this program will be used for any activity specifically designed to urge or influence a State or local legislator to favor or oppose the adoption of any specific legislative proposal pending before any State or local legislative body. Such activities include both direct and indirect (e.g., "grassroots") lobbying activities, with one exception. This does not preclude a State official whose salary is supported with NHTSA funds from engaging in direct communications with State or local legislative officials, in accordance with customary State practice, even if such communications urge legislative officials to favor or oppose the adoption of a specific pending legislative proposal.

PROBLEM STATEMENT

Identify the traffic safety related problem or deficiency that the proposed grant is intended to correct.

According to a major recommendation of Hawaii's Traffic Records Assessment in September 2011 (under 2-A: Crash Data Component), the Hawaii Traffic Records Coordinating Committee (TRCC) should "make solving the crash timeliness problem as the number one traffic records priority for the State." The assessment team urged that "Hawaii devote the bulk of its Section 408 grant funds to electronic field data collection and electronic submission until the problems are solved." As a result, the HTRCC has deemed projects relating to electronic transfer of crash records and electronic Motor Vehicle Accident Reports (MVAR) as a top priority.

We have implemented a File Transfer Protocol (FTP) with our Motor Vehicle Accident Reports and Hawaii Department of Transportation. It's currently a manual process; however, we are working on making this automated- we are about 2 years away for this to happen. MPD is in the process of changing their entire CADS/RMS systems. However, we are currently working on towards the SHACA project.

The current problem is we can not obtain real time or current crash data from DOT as we do not provide them with the information daily. The problem is without cras

real time or current crash data from DOT as we do not provide them with the information daily. The problem is without crash data it can be difficult to identify causes of crashes at certain locations and identify the need for specific enforcement. Furthermore, the issuance of citations by patrol sector is still paper. This is very time consuming and inaccuracies are inevitable as the citations must be manually entered on the judicary side. With the implementation of TBL for traffic officers and parking enforcement, we have been able to significantly reduce the amount of time it takes from citation issuance to judiciary acceptance. We would like to increase the amount of users of TBL and help in reducing errors and inaccuracies with judiciary.

Lastly, with the addition of Berla iVe

Infotainment system software we are able to download valuable information from a vehicles infotainment system. This information is very uselful in crash investigations. To accomplish this we are purchasing the Berla iVe software but need a stand alone laptop that has administrative rights. Also the new laptop will be able to be used to communicate with the data collector for the Pix4D software. Being able to download directly to our own laptop directly circumvents security conerns with our network county IT managers, who refuse to allow us administrative rights to local desktops out of abundance of caution for security protocls.

The goal of this grant is to: 1. Decrease the time it takes to transfer crash data reports from MPD to the State of Hawaii Department of Transportation by 90%, from the baseline data of one month to one day, once the MVAR is completed by the investigator;
2. Continue with the electronic issuance of traffic citations and incorporate analytics data (pilot program/phase II) to state agencies by September 30, 2021; and
3. Improve the timeliness that is takes from issuing a citation until the Judiciary receives the citation.

GRANT OBJECTIVES

Objectives are tasks or activities conducted in order to accomplish the grant goal(s) (e.g., develop permanent fitting stations for child restraints, enforcement activities, educational activities, etc.). The grant activities that will be conducted to achieve the grant goals are:

- 1. Work with the department's I.T. project coordinator and establish more fluent electronic transmission of motor vehicle accidents to the State of Hawaii DOT by September 30, 2021;
- 2. Continue the department's pilot program with the use of electronic citation equipment, not limited to equipment and required training by September 30, 2021;
- 3. Address printing and legibility concerns with the Department of Motor Vehicles and Thin Blue Line as it applies to Hawaii motor vehicle registrations. Currently the accuracy rate is about 10%.
- 4. Meet with other state departments and agencies on a regular basis (monthly) via the Hawaii Traffic Records Coordinating Committee and e-citation sub-committee;
- 5. Send two (2) people to the 2021 International Forum on Traffic Records during August 2021; and
