The Nuances of Homelessness

- Those with financial challenges: the working poor; recently laid off; escaping domestic violence; recently divorced; or other life changes.
- Those that with substance abuse and/or behavioral health issues.
- Those that want to live outdoors/unencumbered.
- Those that move to Maui; were previously homeless or close to homeless elsewhere.



How we impact Those with substance abuse and/or behavioral health issues.

- Provide immediate housing.
- Provide detox services.
- Provide crises support services.
- Provide substance abuse treatment and behavioral health counseling.
- Address issues that may lend themselves to homelessness.
- Address issues that may be generated by homelessness.
- Provided extended housing options through Sober Living Programs.

How We Work

- Client may be approached by a Crisis Mobile Outreach staff member.
- Client may be referred by MMMC staff or MCCC staff.
- Client may come in to Detox or LCRS Crisis Program.
- Client may then move in to Residential Treatment.
- Client may be self-referred to Residential Treatment.
- Client may go on to live in Sober Living Program home.

As a client progresses through these steps we are able to provide a continuum of care over a period of time.



How We Work

During this period client will receive appropriate treatment and support:

Detox support.

Crisis intervention and support.

Substance abuse treatment.

Behavioral health treatment.

Support services.

Skill building.

Food and housing.

This support can last from a week to a year, and longer.



Numbers & Dollars

- Collectively in our three partner agencies we serve 8,000 individuals per year, with a budget of \$16,900,000.
- This is an average of \$2,113 per person.
- Comparatively:
 - One night in the hospital \$2,644 One year in jail \$29,425



Numbers & Dollars

 Specific programs addressing homelessness, as it relates to substance abuse and behavioral health:

Crisis Mobile Outreach – 500 clients per year

LCRS Crisis Support – 200 clients per year

Detox – 400 clients per year

Residential Treatment – 400 clients per year

Intensive Outpatient/Outpatient— 130 clients per year

Maui Drug Court – 100 clients per year

Sober Living Program – 130 clients per year



Numbers & Dollars

Annual Costs for Programs:

Crisis Mobile Outreach \$942,000 LCRS Crisis Support \$1,127,000 Detox \$576,000 Residential Treatment \$1,805,000 Intensive Outpatient/Outpatient \$347,000 Maui Drug Court \$500,000 Sober Living Program \$270,000



What We Need to Better Address Homelessness

- Improve and expand our Sober Living Program by adding a specific behavioral health approach and qualified staff person ~\$100,000/year.
- To fully utilize our existing services without generating debt to other programs ~\$250,000/year
- Expand our Residential Treatment Program by adding an additional dorm facility
 - ~\$205,000 design & consulting
 - ~\$950,000 construction, permitting, sitework, etc.
