A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING  
THE FISCAL YEAR 2021 BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI  
AS IT PERTAINS TO APPENDIX C - CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS,  
DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS (2021 FLOODING EVENT, ROAD AND DRAINAGE  
INFRASTRUCTURE DAMAGES)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 5099, Bill No. 64 (2020), Draft 1, as amended, "Fiscal Year 2021 Budget", Appendix C – Capital Improvement Projects, is hereby amended as it pertains to the Department of Public Works, Countywide, by adding a project entitled "2021 Flooding Event, Road and Drainage Infrastructure Damages" and project description, to read as follows:

<b>"APPENDIX C - Capital Improvement Projects</b>		
Capital improvement project funding may not be used for any purpose other than as described in this appendix. The total amount appropriated for a project may be used for the work phases provided in the project description. A budget amendment shall be requested if the total amount appropriated will be insufficient to complete all work phases set forth in the project description or if the project description does not clearly represent the work to be performed

CBS-6069	<b>a. Countywide Bridge and Drainage Improvements</b>	2,850,000
	Funding for land acquisition, planning, design, construction, and construction management to support ongoing County CIP bridge and drainage projects and programs; and for the following FY 21 projects: 1) Countywide Bridge Inspection Program - conduct biennial inspections of County bridges in accordance with FHWA National Bridge Inspection Standards and AASHTO Manual for Condition Evaluation of Bridges to develop repair recommendations and cost estimates. The inspection program is a pre-requisite to receiving federal funds for repairs; 2) Countywide Bridge and Drainage Improvements - funding for storm response, drainage improvements to mitigate flooding in areas without adequate infrastructure, and for emergency repairs to damaged or failing assets that pose a hazard to public safety.	
CBS-6070	<b>b. Countywide Facilities Maintenance Program</b>	2,675,000

	Funding for planning, design, construction, and construction management to support ongoing County CIP facility maintenance projects and the following FY 2021 projects at the Kalana O Maui Campus, the County Service Center, and Highway's district baseyards. The projects include, but are not limited to the following: 1) Countywide Facilities Maintenance, to perform emergency repairs to damaged or failing equipment and building components; 2) Kalana O Maui Air Conditioning Piping Replacements, for design and construction to replace the air conditioning system waterlines; 3) Kalana O Maui Panel Siding Repairs, for construction of structural repairs and to replace the panel siding along the East and South building faces; 4) Kalana O Maui Stairwell Maintenance, to repaint stairwells and railings; and to add stair treads; 5) Old Courthouse Repairs, to replace windows and the air conditioning compressor; 6) Old Courthouse Building Basement/Admin Remodel - for design improvements to convert the basement space into a conference room; and 7) Fuel tank replacement at the Hana Baseyard.

	Funding for land acquisition, planning, design, and construction to support ongoing County CIP traffic operations and safety projects, and for the following FY 2021 projects: 1) Bikeway and Sidewalk Improvements, improve and expand bicycle and pedestrian facilities and to increase awareness and education for bicycle and pedestrian safety, including Bike Plan Hawaii improvements, sidewalk network gap removal, and roadway safety education program; 2) Safety improvements, respond to public requests for safety improvements, address roadway concerns by installing guardrails, signs, striping, traffic signals, street lighting, speed humps and other traffic calming devices, shoulder widening, road realignment, and other improvements at intersections, crosswalks, and along County roadways. Projects to include Haleakala Highway and Makawao Avenue traffic signal upgrade; accessibility improvements; traffic data collection; and annual traffic calming program at Haiku Road, Kauhale Street, Kokomo Road, Lower Kula Road, Makani Road, Omaopio Road, Olinda Road, West Kuiaha Road, and Holopuni Road; 3) Traffic Signal Modernization, continue design and begin construction of upgrades to existing traffic signal systems at South Maui district intersections including replacement of controller hardware, detection, and signal faces; 4) Wainee Street traffic safety measures; 5) Planning to develop recommendations for improving traffic safety at the Hansen Road intersection at Pulehu Road.

	<u>Funding from the County's Emergency Fund for land acquisition, planning, design, permitting, construction, and construction management to support projects resulting from the 2021 flooding event relating to road and drainage infrastructure damages. Projects to include: 1) Kaupakalua Bridge #35 at Peahi Road for repair of asphalt pavement, reconstruction of abutment at East approach, and construction for a new bridge deck; 2) Kaupakalua Road Shoulder Stabilization at Lepo Street for construction of retaining wall, slope stabilization, and installation of guardrail; 3) Haiku Road near Hog Back Road Slope Stabilization and Guardrail Repair for construction of retaining walls, installation of guardrails, and replacement of asphalt pavement; 4) Awalau Road Repair for construction of GRP lining to stabilize embankments, installation of guardrails, repair of CRM wingwalls/abutments of culverts, and repair of roadway pavement; 5) Kealakapu Road Pavement and Erosion repairs for construction of new pavement, repair of shoulder erosion, and restoration of pavement; 6) Piilani Highway Crossing at Nu'u Gulch Washout for restoration of asphalt and concrete pavement and repair of culvert structure; 7) Makena Road Crossing at Kaukahi Street for replacement of guardrails, repair of culvert structure, and repair of shoulder areas; 8) Polipoli Road Embankment Repair to rebuild the shoulder embankment; and 9) Molokai Akau Street Sinkhole at Pohaku Street to patch drainline at separated joint and backfill sinkhole area and repavement.</u>
