Description: Amend Bill No. 46 (2021) to condition the use of the Special Management Area Revolving Fund for a portion of the

Hamakualoa Open Space Preserve Master Plan.

Motion: Move to amend page 55, Bill 46 (2021), Appendix A, Part II, as

it relates to the Special Management Area Revolving Fund

("Fund") to insert the following condition:

"Up to \$200,000 must be for the portion of the Hamakualoa Open Space Master Plan that relates to planning, studies, permitting, and implementation for parcels along the

shoreline for purposes of providing shoreline access."

Effect: See attached marked-up copy.

Reasons: Section 3.49.020, A. (3), states: "A. The special management

area revolving fund shall provide funds to be used for the

following purposes:

"Master planning, studies, permitting, and implementation pertaining to coastal realignment, beach and shoreline management, beach or dune restoration, or managed retreat."

The Hamakua Open Space is fully within the SMA zone, along the coast and portions will be used for coastal access. Historically, the Hamakualoa Open Space coast has been used traditionally for fishing and access to the coast.

The Hamakualoa Open Space may require master planning and permitting for protecting and enhancing shoreline access.

Furthermore, the Director of Planning noted that "the Fund might be appropriate" for "the shoreline parcels for the purpose of providing shoreline access."

For these reasons, I believe the SMA Fund is appropriate for a portion of the master plan.

SUBJECT: SPECIAL MANAGEMENT AREA REVOLVING FUND

Thank you for your May 21, 2021 letter asking about use of the Special Management Area Revolving Fund (Fund) established pursuant to Chapter 3.49, Maui County Code, for master planning for the Hamakualoa Open Space Reserve (Reserve).

After reviewing the purpose of the Fund as noted in Chapter 3.49 and considering the parcels that comprise the Reserve, it seems that it would be a stretch to use the Fund to master plan all or part of the Reserve. Section 3.49.020.A.3 allows the Fund to be used for "master planning, studies, permitting, and implementation pertaining to coastal realignment, beach and shoreline management, beach or dune restoration, or managed retreat."

Coastal realignment and managed retreat appear inapplicable. Only one of the Reserve's parcels is situated along the shoreline (TMK 2-7-007: 079), and it is not clear that beach and shoreline management would be a compelling component of a master plan for the entire Reserve. Similarly, this shoreline area would not be appropriate for beach or dune restoration because the one shoreline parcel contains no sandy beaches or dunes. However, if it is believed or expected that a master plan would focus only on the shoreline parcel and would have the primary purpose of providing shoreline access, then the Fund might be an appropriate funding source for that narrow scope.
