## SUBJECT: FISCAL YEAR 2022 PROPOSED ANNUAL OPERATING BUDGET

As Treasurer of the Hawai'i State Association of Counties (HSAC), I am submitting the attached proposed annual operating budget for Fiscal Year 2022 (FY22) from July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022. Thematically, the budget proposal maintains most estimates from FY20 and/or FY21 and anticipates that some level of travel will still occur. For ease of review, the document includes the FY20 and FY21 proposals as well as the FY21 year-to-date. The budget proposal includes an estimated \$10,000 in revenue from the conference as voted in the May 13, 2021 meeting, which represents a decrease in the estimate that was based upon the last year with a conference. With that change, the budget still has sufficient net balance (\$21,351) to assume a lesser amount of conference net revenue. Finally, the budget proposal recommends a \$40,000 capacity building membership fee from Honolulu as well as the addition of consulting capacity to support HSAC's administrative functions.

The proposed budget incorporates the following assumptions and changes:

- 1. Membership Fees of \$10,920 for each county will remain the same at \$43,680. Honolulu will be assessed a one-time membership fee of \$40,000 towards organizational capacity-building.
- 2. Conference Income will reflect approximately \$10,000 for the annual conference hosted by the County of Hawai'i.
- 3. Interest Income will remain at \$35.
- 4. Miscellaneous line-item will be removed.
- 5. NACo Prescription Drug Marketing Fee will remain at \$500.
- 6. The Fund Balance reflects an estimated prior year carryover of \$173,569, which includes current balances, an estimated \$10,000 in expenses before July 1, 2021, and the proposed capacity building membership fee.
- 7. Total Revenues and Fund Balance will increase to \$242,784.
- 8. Executive Committee Travel-Air, Ground, Lodging and Registration remains at FY21 estimates of \$33,600 to include: 1) \$12,600 for members' airfare and ground transportation to attend monthly Executive Committee meetings (\$350 x 3 members x 12 meetings), 2) \$5,000 for members' travel costs to State Legislature, and 3) \$16,000 for members' airfare, ground transportation, lodging, and registration to attend two conferences (\$2,000 x 4 members x 2 conferences).

- 9. Executive Committee Auditing/Professional Services will remain at \$6,000.
- 10. Executive Committee Meeting Supplies will remain at \$1,730 and include: 1) \$150 for office supplies, and 2) \$500 for annual subscription for HSAC website, and 3) \$1,080 for meeting refreshments (\$90 x 12 meetings).
- 11. Executive Committee Online Quickbooks Annual Fee will increase to \$900 for anticipated increase of monthly subscription fees (\$75 x 12 months).
- 12. Special Committee Travel will remain the same at \$500.
- 13. Special Committee Miscellaneous will remain the same at \$100.
- 14. NACo Travel-Board-Air, Ground, Lodging, and Registration will remain the same at \$24,000 (\$2,000 x 4 Board Directors x 3 meetings).
- 15. NACo Travel-Steering Committee-Air and Ground will be renamed as NACo Travel-Steering Committee-Air, Ground, Lodging and Registration, and will remain the same at \$8,000 (\$2,000 x 2 Steering Committee Chairs/Vice-Chairs x 2 meetings).
- 16. NACo Promotional will remain at \$7,676.
- 17. NACo Dues will remain the same at \$27,268.
- 18. NACo Miscellaneous line-item will be removed, \$1,426 will move to NACo Promotional, and \$574 will be deleted.
- 19. WIR Travel-Air, Ground, Lodging, and Registration will remain the same at \$12,000 (\$2,000 x 2 Board Members x 3 meetings).
- 20. WIR Promotional will remain the same at \$1,000.
- 21. WIR Dues will remain the same at \$3,804.
- 22. HSAC Promotion and Outreach line-item remains at the FY20 level.
- 23. HSAC Consulting Fund will be increased to \$70,000 to include the proposal to hire an Executive Director or another-titled staff HSAC Management position to support HSAC, officers, and board members and provide continuity of administrative tasks such as bookkeeping, minutes, and documents. This could be either one contract that includes both the administrative and lobbying work or two separate contracts for each. To note, IRS restricts the lobbying-related expenses to 20% of the total estimated exempt-purpose expenditures (\$196,433 x 20% = \$39,286).
- 24. Total Expenses of \$206,433 will be offset by the Total Revenues and Fund Balance with a net balance of \$21,351.
