A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI TO ENTER INTO AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, STATE OF HAWAII

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. <u>Purpose</u>. The Department of the Attorney General, State of Hawaii ("Agency"), through the Crime Prevention and Justice Assistance Division, has awarded a grant to the Department of the Prosecuting Attorney, County of Maui, from the Hawaii's Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Victim Assistance Grant Program, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit "1", in the amount of SIX HUNDRED SIXTY THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED SIXTY DOLLARS (\$660,460). The County of Maui is required to provide matching funds in the amount of ONE HUNDRED SIXTY-FOUR THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$164,865), which was provided in the Fiscal Year 2022 Budget for the Department of the Prosecuting Attorney.

Section 2.20.020, Maui County Code, provides that, unless authorized by ordinance, the Mayor shall not enter into any intergovernmental agreement or any amendment thereto which places a financial obligation upon the county or any department or agency thereof.

SECTION 2. <u>Council authorization</u>. Pursuant to Section 2.20.020, Maui County Code, the Council of the County of Maui hereby authorizes the Mayor to execute the Agreement, all other necessary documents relating to the Agreement, and any amendments thereto. SECTION 3. <u>Effective date.</u> This ordinance shall take effect upon its approval. All action heretofore taken, not inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance, is hereby ratified, approved and affirmed.
