PROBLEM STATEMENT

MAUI POLICE DEPARTMENT SPEED ENFORCEMENT

Grant No: SC22-M-03

Identify the traffic safety related problem or deficiency that the proposed grant is intended to correct.

Speeding on roadways is always a major concern for the Maui Police Department. One of the most common heard complaints from citizens across Maui County is motor vehicle speeding. With the increase in visitor arrivals and those moving to Maui County, our highways are heavily utilized and unfortunately Speeding has been a contributing factor in fatal crashes here in Maui County. During FY2021, we saw a significant decrease in visitors and this opened the roadways to a dangerously noticeable increease in speeding. From April 27, 2020 to June 14, MPD saw a 61% increase in speeding contacts. SCHOOL ZONE SPEEDING - Speeding in the designated school zones has been a growing concern for the Maui Police Department; with increased school enrollment as well as motor vehicles on the roadway we will continue to focus on our fifteen (15) primary school zones. We know that pedestrians are more likely to be struck crossing the roadway in general; however, children being shorter are more likely to be struck by motorist than an adult. The police motorcycle enforcement detail has been the primary unit addressing community-based concern. We continue to enforce the speeding and reckless driving in the school zones as a department.

The goal of the Maui Police Department is: 1. To reduce speed-related fatalities in Maui County from 45 percent in 2020 to 25 percent by December 31, 2022 through strict enforcement; media-related public service announcements designed to address specific operations related to the enforcement/education of speed rules on grant funded overtime						
2. Using a data driven approach, speed enforcement will be conducted on state and county roadways that have been identified as problem areas with speed-related serious injury/fatal crashes, speeding, and excessive speeding/racing.						
3. MPD will educate on the dangers of speeding to include presentations, community outreach, community engagement, public service announcements and earned media opportunities.						

GRANT OBJECTIVES

1. MPD will conduct 90 speed-related operations which include speed-related citations and/or educational contacts "teaching moments" by September 30, 2022;
2. Conduct 2 Coordinated operations in a designated school zone by September 30, 2022;
3. Conduct a minimum of 2 Educational Community Engagements by September 30, 2022; and
4. Purchase (4) four LTI Truspeed speed measuring lasers by September 30, 2022. The new Truspeed Speed measuring devices will be used by traffic officers to enforce speed limits throughout various location in Maui County.

The Maui Police Department will evaluate the progress of the grant activities through quarterly reporting to the Highway Safety Office. This report will include the number of citations issued, the number of educational contacts made, and the number of speed surveys conducted on highways and school zones, to include the number of citations issued by Solo Motorcycle unit.

At the end of the grant period, an evaluation of the number of speed related fatalities will be compared to the baseline total from the 2021 calendar year. Speed surveys in the school zones/problematic roadways will provide statistics as to the effectiveness of speed enforcement in our school zones and problematic roadways. The combined efforts will provide MPD with speed compliance and the effectiveness of the department's strategies. Speed surveys will be listed on our quarterly reports.

MPD will conduct a minimum of 92 speed-related operations during the FFY, which include speed-related citations, educational contacts "teaching moments," presentations, community outreach, educational community engagement and earned media opportunities. An operation is defined as a single officer conducting speed enforcement, presentations, community outreach, etc.

In addition, MPD will conduct at least 2 coordinated operations in a designated school zone during the federal fiscal year. A coordinated operation is defined as a coordinated effort with a minimum of two personnel. for speed engagement efforts, to include enforcement, education, and other traffic related community involvement. An operation is defined as a coordinated effort with a minimum of three personnel.

Using a data driven approach, speed enforcement will be conducted on state and county roadways that have been identified as problem areas with speed-related serious injury/fatal crashes, speeding, and excessive speeding/racing.

Personnel Costs - Overtime rate is the average based on past years using a Police Officer III L3 pay scale. Some officers are at a higher rate and some will be at a lower rate. Participation in the speed enforcement is voluntary so at this time it is unknown as to which officers will be participating. Officers will specifically be watching for speed type violations on highways and problematic roadways; to include school zones. The current projected O/T rate for a PO9 L-3 is \$98.07 including fringe @ 44.41% (OT rate \$67.91 x .4441 Fringe rate = (\$98.07)

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into by and between the STATE OF HAWAII by and through its Director of Transportation, hereinafter referred to as "State," and the Governmental Unit named in this application, hereinafter referred to as "Applicant."

WHEREAS, the National Highway Safety Act of 1966 (Public Law 89-564) provides Federal funds to the STATE for approved highway safety projects, and

WHEREAS, STATE may make said funds available to various state, county or municipal agencies or governments or political subdivisions upon application and approval by STATE and the UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, and

WHEREAS, STATE is obligated to reimburse the UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION out of its funds for any ineligible or unauthorized expenditures for which Federal funds have been claimed and payment received, and

WHEREAS, the above name APPLICANT has submitted an application for Federal funds for highway safety projects.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF MUTUAL PROMISES AND OTHER GOOD AND VALUABLE CONSIDERATION, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

The APPLICANT will comply with applicable statutes and regulations, including but not limited to:

- •23 U.S.C. Chapter 4 Highway Safety Act of 1966, as amended
- •Sec. 1906, Pub. L. 109-59, as amended by Sec. 4011, Pub. L. 114-94
- •23 CFR part 1300 Uniform Procedures for State Highway Safety Grant Programs
- •2 CFR part 200 Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards
- •2 CFR part 1201 Department of Transportation, Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards

NONDISCRIMINATION

- The APPLICANT will comply with all Federal statutes and implementing regulations relating to nondiscrimination ("Federal Nondiscrimination Authorities"). These include but are not limited to:
- •Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 2000d et seq., 78 stat. 252), (prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin) and 49 CFR part 21;

- •Agrees to comply (and require its subrecipients, contractors, subcontractors, and consultants to comply) with all applicable provisions of law or regulation governing US DOT's or NHTSA's access to records, accounts, documents, information, facilities, and staff, and to cooperate and comply with any program or compliance reviews, and/or complaint investigations conducted by US DOT or NHTSA under any Federal Nondiscrimination Authority;
- •Acknowledges that the United States has a right to seek judicial enforcement with regard to any matter arising under these Non-Discrimination Authorities and this Assurance;
- •Agrees to insert in all contracts and funding agreements with other State or private entities the following clause:
- "During the performance of this contract/funding agreement, the contractor/funding recipient agrees—
- a. To comply with all Federal nondiscrimination laws and regulations, as may be amended from time to time:
- b. Not to participate directly or indirectly in the discrimination prohibited by any Federal nondiscrimination law or regulation, as set forth in appendix B of 49 CFR part 21 and herein;
- c.To permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and its facilities as required by the State highway safety office, US DOT or NHTSA;
- d. That, in event a contractor/funding recipient fails to comply with any nondiscrimination provisions in this contract/funding agreement, the State highway safety agency will have the right to impose such contract/agreement sanctions as it or NHTSA determine are appropriate, including but not limited to withholding payments to the contractor/funding recipient under the contract/agreement until the contractor/funding recipient complies; and/or cancelling, terminating, or suspending a contract or funding agreement, in whole or in part; and
- e.To insert this clause, including paragraphs (a) through (e), in every subcontract and subagreement and in every solicitation for a subcontract or sub-agreement, that receives Federal funds under this program.

POLITICAL ACTIVITY (HATCH ACT)

The APPLICANT will comply with provisions of the Hatch Act (5 U.S.C. 1501-1508), which limits the political activities of employees whose principal employment activities are funded in whole or in part with Federal funds.

CERTIFICATION REGARDING FEDERAL LOBBYING
