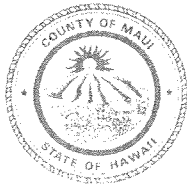

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. 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

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 5217, Bill No. 46 (2021), Draft 1, as amended, "Fiscal Year 2022 Budget", Appendix C – Capital Improvement Projects, is hereby amended as it pertains to the Department of Environmental Management, Wailuku-Kahului Community Plan Area by adding a project and project description for the Kahului and Waiehu Beach Road Sewer Line Upgrade in the amount of \$250,000, to read as follows:


