THE AMENDMENT ALSO CREATES A NEW HOUSING ADVISORY BOARD TASKED WITH ADVISING AND SUPPORTING THE HOUSING DIRECTOR'S EFFORTS TO CREATE AFFORDABLE HOUSING. FURTHER, THIS AMENDMENT CREATES A NEW POSITION WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING, TO ACT AS A LIAISON WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOMELANDS. MAUI COUNTY WATER AUTHORITY ALLOWING ESTABLISHMENT OF REGIONAL AUTHORITIES. THIS PROPOSAL INITIATED BY THE COUNCIL WOULD SPECIFICALLY MANDATE THE CREATION OF THE EAST MAUI

CAN YOU HEAR ME? >> YES, WE CAN.\r\n\r\n>> YES. I JUST WANTED TO TESTIFY, I GUESS YOU DON'T WANT ME TO DO THE RESOLUTION NOW JUST THE TWO BILLS, IS THAT RIGHT? OKAY. >> WHATEVER IS CALLED UP, YOU CAN TESTIFY ON. RIGHT NOW WE'RE ON COMMITTEE REPORTS. >> OKAY. COMMITTEE REPORT 22-87. I FEEL THIS IS AN IMPORTANT BILL THAT I SUPPORT, AND WE REALLY NEED TO PROTECT OUR WETLANDS AND THE ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS DEFINES THEM IN A WAY THAT DOESN'T MAKE THE WETLANDS ACTUALLY WETLANDS IN MAUI, BECAUSE WE HAVE WETLANDS THAT DON'T MEET THE CRITERIA.\r\n\r\nAND IT HELPS US TO IDENTIFY THEM, DEFINE THEM, AND PROTECT THEM, BECAUSE OF COURSE, AS WE ALL PROBABLY KNOW, THE WETLANDS ARE A VERY IMPORTANT FUNCTION IN THAT THEY CATCH THE FLOODWATERS BEFORE THEY HIT THE OCEAN, ALLOWING ALL OF THE SEDIMENT AND SILT AND NOW POLLUTANTS FROM OUR DEVELOPMENTS TO SETTLE INTO THE GROUND BEFORE IT GOES OUT TO THE REEF AND INTO THE OCEAN. WHEN WE DEVELOP A CHANNEL THROUGH THAT GETS RID OF THAT NATURAL EFFECT AND CREATING AND IDENTIFYING THOSE WETLANDS TO PROTECT OUR OCEAN AND PROTECT THE TOURISM INDUSTRY AND THE LIVELIHOOD OF OUR RESIDENTS, AS WELL AS QUALITY OF LIFE AND NOT TO MENTION THE FISH AND ENVIRONMENT AND MARINE LIVE BEING KILLED AS YOU SAW WHAT HAPPENED IN MAUI MEADOWS. PERSONALLY I DID SEE HOW IMPORTANT THOSE WETLANDS ARE TO APPROPRIATE NATURAL FUNCTION IN THE ECOLOGY OF THE AREA. SO I STRONGLY SUPPORT WORKING ON THAT, AND THIS BILL GOES TOWARDS THAT GOAL. SO THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR BRINGING THAT FORWARD, AND I HOPE YOU ALL PASS IT FORTHWITH WITH NO PROBLEMS. AND THEN ALSO THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING 22-81, I WANT TO SAY I REALLY FEEL YOU NEED TO WORK ON IT AND DEFINITELY ALL THE TIME A BIG ISSUE IN OUR COUNTY. I SUPPORT GETTING THIS PASSED.\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU FOR THE WORK ON THIS, AND THIS IS ANOTHER STEP TOWARDS HAVING MORE AFFORDABLE HOUSING HERE IN MAUI COUNTY. AND I GUESS I NEED TO HOLD MY SUPPORT OF RESOLUTION 22-206 UNTIL WE GET TO THAT ASPECT, IF I CAN STAY ON, I WILL TRY TO. THANK YOU. THAT IS ALL I HAVE NOW. I'M COMPLETE. >> THANK YOU. ANDREW CHOY, FOLLOWED BY DAVID DORN. >> GOOD MORNING. >> ALOHA FRIDAY, COUNCIL MEMBERS.\r\n\r\nMY NAME IS ANDREW CHOY AND I'M TESTIFYING ON BEHALF OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOMELANDS ON COMMITTEE REPORT NO. 22-85, RELATED TO BILL NO. 121. THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOMELANDS IS IN STRONG UP THE SUPPORT OF THIS BILL AND PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO COUNTY CODE SECTION 4.8.500 WILL PROVIDE FINANCIAL RELIEF TO BENEFICIARIES THAT HAVE A HOMESTEAD LEASE WITHIN THE COUNTY. OFTEN HOMESTEADERS IN ARREARS OF PROPERTY TAX PAYMENTS FIND THEMSELVES IN THE SITUATION DUE TO UNFORTUNATE TRAUMATIC EVENTS AND PREVENTING A LESSEE FROM CLAIMING A HOME EXEMPTION AND CREATING A HIGHER TAX BURDEN FOR THE LESSEE WILL MAKE IT HARD FOR TO MAKE PAYMENTS ON BACK TAXES OWED TO THE COUNTY AND PUT THEM IN FURTHER ARREARS AND MAHALO NUI FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION OF OUR TESTIMONY. >> THANK YOU. I WILL NEED TO GET BACK TO YOU ON THAT.\r\n\r\nI NEED TO CHECK WITH OUR HOMESTEAD SERVICES DIVISION THAT OVERSEES THE LEASES THAT ARE MANAGED BY THE DEPARTMENT WITH OUR 99-YEAR

HOMESTEAD LEASES. SO I CAN GET BACK TO YOU ON THAT ANSWER -- WITH THAT ANSWER. >> THANK YOU, MR. CHOY. THANK YOU, CHAIR. >> ANY MORE OUESTIONS, MEMBERS? IF NOT, THANK YOU, MR.\r\n\r\nCHOY. MADAM CLERK. >> CHAIR, YOUR NEXT TESTIFIER IS MR. DAVID DORN, TO BE FOLLOWED BY MIKE MORAN. >> GOOD MORNING, COUNCIL MEMBERS. SUSADEI. MY NAME IS DAVID DORN AND I'M NOT A LOBBYIST AND SPEAKING TODAY ON BEHALF OF THE SOUTH MAUI SAVE THE WETLANDS HUI AND ON BEHALF OF THE SIERRA CLUB MAUI.\r\n\r\nAFFORDABLE HOUSING TOP PRIORITY TO PROVIDE SHELTER AND STABILITY FOR LOCAL RESIDENTS. BILL 107 HELPS MAKE AFFORDABLE HOUSING MORE AFFORDABLE FOR LOCAL FAMILIES. PLEASE SUPPORT THIS BILL ON FIRST READING. I WILL BE IN SUPPORT OF THE 22-206 TO THE MA'ALAEA WATERSHED AND YOU HAVE MY TESTIMONY IN WRITING. I WOULD LIKE TO SAY THAT WE IN PARTICULAR INTEREST SUPPORT 22-87 TO PASS THE WETLANDS BILL NO. 91 TODAY ON FIRST READING, AND AGAIN, WE APPLAUD YOU ALL FOR CRAFTING THIS IMPORTANT DOCUMENT, THAT WILL SET US UP ON A BETTER PATH GOING FORWARD. YOU HEARD ME SPEAK MANY TIMES ON THE IMPORTANCE OF WETLANDS AND IT'S NEVER BEEN MORE IMPORTANT THAN NOW.\r\n\r\nWETLANDS ARE PART OF A HEALTHY WATERSHED AND FOUNDATION OF OUR CULTURE AND CIVILIZATION. WATER IS LIFE AND WITHOUT WATER THERE IS NO LIFE. WE'RE SEEING IN THE NEWS MANY EXAMPLES CATASTROPHIC 100-YEAR FLOODING WIDESPREAD DEBILITATING DROUGHTS AND BREAK DOWNS IN WATER SUPPLIES FOR MANY CITIES. THESE EVENTS ARE LEADING TO SICKNESS AND SPREAD OF DISEASES. WE'RE NOT IMMUNE TO THIS AND WE NEED TO PROTECT OUR NATURAL RESOURCES NOW MORE THAN EVER, AND GOING FORWARD TO HELP US COMBAT THE EFFECTS OF ONGOING CLIMATE CHANGE. SO PLEASE, PASS THIS BILL TODAY, SO WE CAN BEGIN TO REPAIR THE LIFE SUSTAINING WETLANDS, AND AQUIFERS PASSED DOWN TO US, SO WE CAN PROTECT THEM FOR OUR COMMUNITY AND FOR FUTURE GENERATIONS. THANK YOU.\r\n\>> THANK YOU. MEMBERS, QUESTIONS? THANK YOU, MR. DORN. MADAM CLERK. >> OUR NEXT TESTIFIER IS MR. MIKE MORAN.\r\n\r\n>> ALOHA CHAIR LEE, AND COUNCIL MEMBERS. MIKE MORAN FOR THE KIHEI COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION. WE, TOO, ARE JOINING OUR TWO PRIOR TESTIFIERS FROM SOUTH MAUI DISTRICT ON THE SAME TWO ITEMS, 22-81, AND 22-87. WE HAVE TESTIFIED ON THESE MANY TIMES BEFORE. SO NO NEED TO REPEAT WE'RE IN TOTAL SUPPORT OF BOTH, AND THE COMMENTS THAT WERE MADE BY THE TWO INDIVIDUALS PRECEDING ME JUST ECHO THE SAME THINGS THAT OUR COMMUNITY IS LOOKING FOR, AND IN SUPPORT OF THESE. WE CERTAINLY HOPE THERE ARE NO MORE PROPOSED DELAYS. WE SEEM TO ALMOST GET TO THE FINISH LINE ON SOME OF THESE ISSUES, AND THEN SOMEBODY JUMPS IN AT THE LAST-MINUTE, CREATES CONFUSION. SO WE HOPE TODAY WILL START THE THREE-DAY WEEKEND CELEBRATION AND THESE TWO WILL MOVE FORWARD, AND WE'LL STOP BABBLING ON AND WE'LL TOO BE BACK WHEN THE RESOLUTIONS COME UP.\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO OFFER OUR TESTIMONY FOR THE KCA. ALOHA. >> ALOHA. MEMBERS, QUESTIONS? TALK TO YOU SOON. MADAM CLERK. >> CHAIR, THERE IS NO OTHER INDIVIDUALS CURRENTLY SIGNED UP TO TESTIFY ON THESE ITEMS.\r\n\r\nIF ANYONE WANTS TO TESTIFY ON ITEM -- AGENDA ITEM J, COMMITTEE REPORTS, PLEASE IDENTIFY YOURSELF NOW. THIS IS THE LAST CALL FOR TESTIMONY ON ITEM J, COMMITTEE REPORTS. >> I DO SEE ONE. >> ALOHA. I DID SIGN UP. I'M LISTED ON THE TESTIFIERS UNDER THIS ITEM AS ARE JENNIFER KRAKA AND SEVERAL OTHER PEOPLE. >> SORRY, THANK YOU, MS.\r\n\rDE NAIE. >> OUR NEXT TESTIFIER SIGNED UP FOR COMMITTEE REPORT TESTIMONY IS JENNIFER KRAKA, FOLLOWED BY LUCIENNE DE NAIE. >> ALOHA, COUNTY COUNCIL MEMBERS. I APPRECIATE YOU GUYS LETTING ME HAVE THE TIME TO SPEAK AND FOR ALL YOUR SUPPORT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF AG LEGISLATION TO DATE. I WANT TO THANK COUNCIL MEMBER GABE JOHNSON FOR PROPOSING THIS BILL, AND WORKING WITH THE COMMUNITY IMPACT WORKING GROUP, WHO INVOLVED SO MANY DIFFERENT COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDERS FROM SO MANY DIFFERENT AREAS OF

THE AG SECTOR. THIS TICKET TO THIS POINT THERE WERE MULTIPLE COMMUNITY SURVEYS AND HUNDREDS OF RESPONSES FROM OUR COMMUNITY MEMBERS WHO ARE PRETTY MUCH IN AGREEMENT THAT WILL PASS OUT OF COMMUNITY UNOPPOSED AND THAT SPEAKS VOLUMES FOR OUR AG SECTOR. SO THANK YOU FOR THE SUPPORT AND HOPE YOU CAN CONTINUE TO SUPPORT THIS BILL.\r\n\r\nTHAT IS KIND OF ALL I HAVE, YOU KNOW, IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS, BE HAPPY TO ANSWER THEM. I THINK IT'S PRETTY -- PRETTY WELL-SUPPORTED. SO I WOULD HOPE THAT YOU CONTINUE TO SUPPORT IT. THANK YOU. >> THANK YOU, JENNIFER. ANY QUESTIONS, MEMBERS? IF NOT, THANK YOU.\r\n\r\n>> OUR NEXT TESTIFIER IS LUCIENNE DE NAIE, FOLLOWED BY RITA LOPEZ. >> GOOD MORNING. >> MAHALO NUI LOA. THIS IS LUCIENNE DE NAIE AND I'M HERE TO TESTIFY ON A COUPLE OF THESE MATTERS, UNDER THIS AGENDA ITEM. FIRST, ITEM 22-81, THE NEW AFFORDABLE HOUSING RULES. THIS IS REALLY A BOLD STEP FORWARD, AND I APPLAUD THE ACTIONS OF THE COMMITTEE, THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING COMMITTEE, ALL OF THE CONSULTATIONS, THE GOOD SUGGESTIONS MADE BY ALL OF THE COUNCIL MEMBERS OVER THE TIME OF REVIEW. AND THIS IS AN IMPORTANT FIRST STEP FOR THIS BILL TO MOVE FORWARD, AND TO SEE IF WE CAN MAKE HOUSING MORE ACCESSIBLE TO THOSE WHO ARE IN THE EARNING LIMITS OF OUR CURRENT SITUATION HERE ON MAUI.\r\nSO WE NEED A WAY TO MAKE OUR HOUSING FIT OUR PEOPLE'S INCOME LEVELS AND THIS IS ONE ATTEMPT. ALSO, ON ITEM 22-82, THE KULA AG PARK TRANSFER TO THE DEPARTMENT OF AG. VERY STRONG SUPPORT OF THIS. IT'S GREAT THAT WE HAVE A DEPARTMENT OF AG. THANK YOU FOR THE FORESIGHT IN CREATING THE FIRST COUNTYWIDE DEPARTMENT OF AG, AND OUR AG PARK IS PART OF OUR POTENTIAL SUCCESS STORY HERE. IT'S GOING TO EXPAND. THIS IS THE TIME TO GIVE IT THOSE INDIVIDUALS, WHO WANT TO UTILIZE THIS REASONABLE LAND THE SUPPORT THEY NEED FROM THE DEPARTMENT NEW OF AG.\r\n\r\nMOVING ON TO ITEM 22-83, SETTING POLICIES FOR THE NEW AG DEPARTMENT. I, TOO, APPLAUD, LIKE MS. KRAKA, THE WORK DOWN AND OUTREACH INTO THE AGRICULTURE COMMUNITY, TO SEEK THE BEST TYPE OF FRAMEWORK FOR THIS NEW DEPARTMENT. THIS IS A BOLD UNDERTAKING. HOPEFULLY, ALL OF YOU, WHEN YOU LOOK BACK AT YOUR LEGACIES WILL SAY WOW, WE DID SOMETHING REALLY IMPORTANT, AN IMPORTANT FIRST STEP FOR OUR COUNTY. SO THANK YOU FOR YOUR SUPPORT OF THESE POLICIES AND MOVING THEM FORWARD. LASTLY, BILL 22-87. THIS IS THE WETLANDS BILL.\r\n\r\nAND I'M TESTIFYING ON BEHALF OF MYSELF, AND ALSO AS MR. DORN POINTED OUT, THE SIERRA CLUB OF MAUI IS IN VERY, VERY STRONG SUPPORT OF THIS BILL. OUR WETLANDS ARE A GIFT TO US FROM OUR CREATOR, FROM NATURE. HOWEVER, YOU BELIEVE. AND IF WE DON'T PROPERLY IDENTIFY THEM, AND TRY TO CARE FOR THEM, AND ALLOW THEM TO FUNCTION AS THEY WERE INTENDED IN THE NATURAL ORDER OF THINGS, WE'RE REALLY JUST GOING TO BE FACING WORSE AND WORSE SITUATIONS IN TERMS OF NATURAL CLIMATE EVENTS THAT WE HAVE NO CONTROL OVER. SO WE NEED TO DO WHAT WE CAN TO BE RESILIENT. APPRECIATE ALL OF THE WORK THAT THE CARES COMMITTEE HAS PUT INTO THIS, APPRECIATE ALL OF THE WORK AND RESEARCH BY INDIVIDUAL COUNCIL MEMBERS, AND PLEASE MOVE THIS FORWARD.\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU. >> THANK YOU. ANY QUESTIONS, MEMBERS? IF NOT, THANK YOU, MS. DE NAIE. >> OUR NEXT TESTIFIER, CHAIR, IS RITA LOPEZ, TO BE FOLLOWED BY LAUREN NELSON. >> ALOHA, COUNCIL MEMBERS.\r\n\r\nGOOD TO SEE YOU AGAIN. I'M HERE TO EXPRESS MY STRONG SUPPORT OF THE PROPOSED LEGISLATION BILL 105. IT'S TO ESTABLISH POLICIES RELATED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, AND I BELIEVE THAT THESE RULES AND RESPONSIBILITIES NEED TO BE CLEARLY DEFINED FOR US TO MOVE FORWARD SUCCESSFULLY. WITH THE COMMUNITY IMPACT WORKING GROUP, WORKING WITH JENNIFER, AND THE AGRICULTURAL SECTOR, LEGISLATION WAS CREATED THROUGH COLLABORATION WITH MULTIPLE PEOPLE IN OUR COUNTY. SO COMMUNITY FEEDBACK AND COUNTLESS HOURS OF VOLUNTEERING WITH COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDERS WILL HELP

GUIDE THE DEPARTMENT THROUGH DIFFERENT TRANSITIONS IN LEADERSHIP. SO I URGE YOU TO SUPPORT THIS BILL, AND APPROVE THIS BILL MOVING FORWARD. THANK YOU FOR HAVING ME. MAHALO.\r\n\r\n>> THANK YOU. MEMBERS, QUESTIONS? IF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH. >> OUR NEXT TESTIFIER IS LAUREN NELSON. >> ALOHA COUNCIL MEMBERS. GOOD MORNING. MY NAME IS LAUREN NELSON AND I'M HERE TODAY AS AN INDIVIDUAL TO SUPPORT BILL 105. AS RITA JUST EXPLAINED THIS LEGISLATION BILL 105 WAS CREATED IN COLLABORATION WITH FARMERS, RANCHERS AND THE COMMUNITY THROUGH SURVEYS, WHERE THE COMMUNITY VOTED ON THEIR PRIORITIES FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.\r\n\r\nWE NEED THIS LEGISLATION TO ENSURE THAT OUR DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE WILL CREATE A MORE SUSTAINABLE, AND SELF-SUFFICIENT FOOD SYSTEM THAT BENEFITS MAUI COUNTY'S RESIDENTS AND OUR ECONOMY, AND OUR DELICATE ISLAND ECOSYSTEMS. THIS LEGISLATION HAS SOME -- COMPLETE SUPPORT OF THE COMMUNITY, WHICH WE SAW COMING OUT OF COMMITTEE, WHICH AS JENNIFER SAID, SPEAKS VOLUMES. I THANK YOU FOR ALL OF THE SUPPORT THAT THE COUNCIL HAS SHOWN THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO-DATE, AND I ASK THAT YOU PLEASE CONTINUE TO SUPPORT THE DEPARTMENT, AND APPROVE BILL 105. THANK YOU SO MUCH. >> THANK YOU. MEMBERS, QUESTIONS? IF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH. MADAM CLERK.\r\n\r\n>> OUR NEXT TESTIFIER IS LAUREN NELSON, TO BE FOLLOWED BY SCOTT CRAWFORD. >> I JUST TESTIFIED. THANK YOU ALL SO MUCH. >> SORRY, LAUREN. OUR NEXT TESTIFIER IS SCOTT CRAWFORD, AND CURRENTLY THERE IS NOBODY SIGNED UP TO TESTIFY AFTER MR. CRAWFORD. >> ALOHA, MADAM CHAIR, AND MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL.\r\n\r\nJUST WANTED TO QUICKLY ADD SUPPORT FOR 22-83 FOR THE POLICIES FOR DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND MAHALO TO EVERYBODY ON THE COUNCIL, THE STAFF, AND ALL OF THE COMMUNITY MEMBERS, WHO WENT INTO FORMULATING THESE POLICIES. THEY WILL BE A GREAT GUIDELINE FOR THE DEPARTMENT TO GET UP AND RUNNING AND REALLY SERVE OUR AGRICULTURAL COMMUNITY. MAHALO. >> THANK YOU, MR. CRAWFORD. MEMBERS, QUESTIONS? LAST CALL FOR TESTIMONY IN AGENDA ITEM J, COMMITTEE REPORTS. >> GOOD MORNING. >> I SEE MR. PEREZ, MADAM CLERK.\r\n\r\n>> GOOD MORNING, CHAIR LEE. >> GOOD MORNING. >> ALBERT PEREZ HERE. MAY I PROCEED? >> SURE, GO AHEAD. >> ALBERT PEREZ WITH MAUI TOMORROW. GOOD MORNING, COUNCIL MEMBERS.\r\n\r\nI APPRECIATE ALL YOUR HARD WORK AND I'M TRYING TO BE RESPECTFUL OF YOUR TIME BY SUMMARIZING MY TESTIMONY, AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE AS USUAL. I'M FEELING A LITTLE CONFUSED, ACTUALLY A LOT CONFUSED BY THIS NEW METHOD OF TAKING TESTIMONY. I'M FINDING THAT IT'S ACTUALLY WASTEFUL OF OUR TIME AS TESTIFIERS. WE HAD NO WARNING, AT LEAST I DIDN'T HAVE ANY WARNING WE WOULD HAVE TO SPLIT UP YOUR TESTIMONY TO TESTIFY ON ONE THING AND THEN WAIT FOR THE NEXT SECTION TO COME UP. YOU KNOW, ON DAYS LIKE TODAY, WHEN I HAVE OTHER THINGS PLANNED I WAS JUST GOING TO DOWN THE LINE AND TELL YOU WHAT I SUPPORT AND BE PAU. BUT ANYWAY, I HOPE THAT YOU WILL GO BACK TO THE OTHER WAY, BECAUSE I THINK IT'S MUCH BETTER, AND I THINK THAT CITIZENS CAN TRY TO BE RESPECTFUL, AND NOT WASTE THE COUNCIL'S TIME, BUT THIS IS NOT IN MY OPINION. SO JUST BRIEFLY, I WANT TO SUPPORT THE WETLANDS BILL.\r\n\r\nAS I HAVE SAID BEFORE, SORRY WETLANDS HAVE MANY BENEFITS AND PROVIDE THINGS TO US, LIKE SEDIMENT FILTERING, FLOOD CONTROL, AND JUVENILE FISH REARING AND THESE ARE PROVIDED FOR FREE. IF WE HAD TO PAY FOR FACILITIES TO DO THOSE THINGS, COST MILLIONS OF DOLLARS AND ALSO PROTECTION OUR REEFS, PREVENTING COASTAL EROSION. SO WE'RE PROTECTING OUR COASTAL PROPERTIES, PUBLIC AND PRIVATE. BY PROTECTING WETLANDS. ANYWAY, I HOPE THAT YOU WILL PASS THIS TODAY ON

FIRST READING. AND THEN, ON -- CAN I GO ON TO MY OTHER ITEMS? >> IF IT'S UNDER COMMITTEE REPORTS.\r\n\r\n>> THIS ONE IS. YES. SALES PRICE GUIDELINES, AFFORDABLE HOUSING GUIDELINES. YOU KNOW, FOR ME THE BOTTOM-LINE IS IF PEOPLE CANNOT AFFORD THESE HOMES, THEN WE'RE JUST GOING THROUGH THE MOTIONS, AND EVENTUALLY THEY ARE GETTING SOLD AT MARKET PRICE. AS I SAID YESTERDAY, IN THE PSLU COMMITTEE, EFFECTIVELY WHAT WE HAVE THEN IS A TEMPORARILY AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROGRAM THAT ONLY WORKS FOR SOME PEOPLE. BECAUSE WE'RE NOT GETTING THE 25% OF MARKET. THOSE THINGS THEN GET SOLD AT MARKET-RATE, AND THEN THEY FALL OUT OF AFFORDABILITY CATEGORY IN 5-8 YEARS.\r\n\r\nSO I'M DEDICATING MYSELF AND OFFERING TO HELP WORK ON CREATING A SEPARATE HOUSING MARKET FOR LOCAL RESIDENTS THROUGH THE DEED RESTRICTION PROGRAM THAT I MENTIONED AT THAT MEETING. ANYWAY, I GUESS THAT IS ALL I HAVE FOR THIS SECTION. THANK YOU. >> THANK YOU. MEMBERS, ANY QUESTIONS? IF NOT, I WOULD LIKE TO SAY, MR. PEREZ, THANKS FOR YOUR TESTIMONY.\r\n\r\nWE ALWAYS APPRECIATE YOUR COMMENTS. WHEN IT'S TIME, WE WOULD LIKE YOU TO HELP US LOBBY THE LEGISLATURE TO CHANGE THE LAW BACK, SO THAT WE CAN GO BACK TO THE OLD PROCESS OF HAVING THE TESTIMONY THE WAY WE USED TO. THANK YOU FOR YOUR COMMENTS. >> CHAIR, MAY I RESPOND? >> SURE. >> SO YOU WERE DOING IT THE OTHER WAY IN PREVIOUS MEETINGS. AM I TO UNDERSTAND THAT WAS NOT ALLOWED UNDER THE REVISED SUNSHINE LAW?\r\n\r\>> WELL, NOW, WE HAVE TO NOT ONLY -- WELL, WE HAVE TO PROVIDE OPPORTUNITIES FOR TESTIFIERS TO PRESENT THEIR TESTIMONY BEFORE EACH SECTION COMES UP, WHICH IS VERY DIFFICULT, BECAUSE SOMETIMES WE HAVE 50-60 ITEMS. IN COMMITTEE THAT MIGHT WORK, BUT IN COUNCIL MEETINGS, IT'S DIFFICULT. SO RATHER THAN -- SO OVER THE LAST TWO MEETINGS, I HAVE BEEN TRYING TO PREPARE PEOPLE FOR THIS TRANSITION, AND THAT IS WHY WE HAVE --I MENTIONED IT AT THE LAST MEETING. WE ALSO INDICATED THIS ON OUR AGENDA. BUT I ALSO INCLUDED ON THE AGENDA THAT IF, LET'S SAY YOU ARE CATCHING A PLANE, OR THERE ARE EXTENUATING CIRCUMSTANCES, WE'LL BE HAPPY TO TAKE TESTIMONY AT THE BEGINNING OF THE MEETING, RATHER THAN YOU HAVING TO WAIT FOR EACH ITEM TO COME UP, SUBJECT TO APPROVAL OF THE MEMBERS. THE AMENDMENTS INCLUDE CREATING A SEPARATE -- CREATING SEPARATE METHODS FOR CALCULATING AFFORDABLE SALES PRICE BASED ON WHETHER OR NOT THE DEVELOPER RECEIVES DIRECT SUBSIDIES, AND REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND HUMAN CONCERNS TO CREATE A PROGRAM WITHIN THE HOME ACQUISITION AND OWNERSHIP PROGRAM REVOLVING FUND THAT WILL SUBSIDIZE HOMEBUYERS FOR PROJECTS WHEN THE DEVELOPER DOES NOT RECEIVE DIRECT COUNTY SUBSIDIES. THE BUDGET DIRECTOR SAID THESE FUNDS WOULD NOT BE ISSUED FOR GRANTS OR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS, BUT COSTS SUCH AS REPAIRS. BUDGET DIRECTOR ALSO SAID THE CURRENT ANNUAL REVENUES FOR THE KULA AG PARK ARE \$31,000, SUFFICIENT FOR MINOR INCIDENTS IF ADDITIONAL FUNDS ARE NEEDED AN APPROPRIATION FROM THE GENERAL FUND COULD BE MADE TOO COVER THOSE COSTS. YOUR COMMITTEE AMENDED THE BILL TO ACCOMMODATE ANY NEW COUNTY AGRICULTURAL PARKS THAT MAY BE ESTABLISHED IN THE FUTURE BY REPLACING REFERENCES TO THE KULA AGRICULTURAL PARK WITH "COUNTY OF MAUI AGRICULTURAL PARKS." YOUR COMMITTEE ALSO MOVED THE MANAGEMENT OF THE FUND FROM THE OFFICE OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT TO THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE. YOUR COMMITTEE VOTED 8-0 TO RECOMMEND PASSAGE ON FIRST READING OF THE REVISED PROPOSED BILL AND I RESPECTFULLY ASK FOR THE MEMBERS' CONTINUED SUPPORT OF THIS ITEM. BUT WE FINALLY MET ON AUGUST 17TH, 2022 TO DISCUSS BILL 91 (2022 (TO IMPLEMENT REGULATIONS TO PRESERVE AND PROTECT SENSITIVE ECOSYSTEMS FUNCTIONS AND VALUES, MITIGATE CLIMATE CHANGE AND WORK TOWARDS BUILDING ENVIRONMENTAL RESILIENCE BY ESTABLISHING REQUIREMENTS TO PROTECT WETLANDS INCLUDING THOSE NOT ADJACENT TO NAVIGABLE WATERS AND NOTES THAT THE MAUI COUNTY GENERAL PLAN PROVIDES THE

DIRECTIVES RESTORE AND PROTECT WETLANDS IN THE COUNTYWIDE POLICY PLAN PAGE 86 AND PRESERVE AND RESTORE IN THE MAUI ISLAND PLAN PAGE 2-31. SUPPORT THE PROTECTION AND RESTORATION OF NATURAL SYSTEMS SUCH AS WETLAND AND DUNES FOR FLOOD MITIGATION AND CLIMATE CHANGE, THAT IS IN THE MOLOKA'I ISLAND COMMUNITY PLAN PAGE 55. NATURAL LANDSCAPE FEATURES AND ENVIRONMENTS SUCH AS WETLANDS WILL BE PROTECTED AND RESTORED, THAT IS IN THE LANA'I COMMUNITY PLAN PAGE 2-12. AND PROTECT ALL WETLAND RESOURCES IN THE KIHEI-MAKENA COMMUNITY PLAN PAGE 21, WHICH WILL BE SOON RENAMED THE SOUTH MAUI COMMUNITY PLAN. WETLANDS PROVIDE IMMEASURABLE VALUE INCLUDING FLOOD PROTECTION, WATER QUALITY AND SURFACE AND GROUNDWATER SUPPLY, BIODIVERSITY, WILDLIFE HABITAT AND AESTHETICS AND CLEAN WATER ACT DOESN'T REFLECT COUNTY SPECIFIC GOALS FOR PROTECTING AND ENHANCING ENVIRONMENTAL RESILIENCE, SUCH AS WETLANDS. YOUR COMMITTEE NOTES BILL 91 CD 1 WILL PROVIDE THE COUNTY WITH A NEW TOOL TO MORE PRECISELY PROTECT THE SPECIFIC NEEDS OF THE WETLAND AREAS. YOUR COMMITTEE PUNCH IT NOTES THAT THE COMPREHENSIVE COLLABORATIVE MEETINGS HELD INCLUDING PARTICIPATION FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING, DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS, CORPORATION COUNSEL AND TO INCORPORATE DEPARTMENTS AND COMMUNITY CONCERNS AND AGREED THAT THOROUGHLY AND WIDELY ACCESSIBLE INFORMATION BE PROVIDED TO THE PUBLIC FOR COMMUNITY COMMENT AND FEEDBACK AS WETLANDS ARE MAPPED AND IDENTIFIED AND YOUR COMMITTEE VOTED 7-0 TO VOLUMES PASSAGE ON FIRST READING, AND FILING OF THE COMMUNICATION.\r\n\r\nI RESPECTFULLY ASK FOR THE COUNCIL'S FULL SUPPORT TO PASS BILL 91 CD 1 (2022) ON FIRST READING AND FILING OF THE COMMUNICATION. DISCUSSION, MEMBER PALTIN. >> THANK YOU. YOUR PLANNING AND SUSTAINABLE LAND USE COMMITTEE MET THREE TIMES TO DISCUSS BILL 66 (2022) THE PURPOSE IS TO ADOPT AN AMENDED DIGITAL ZONING MAP FOR THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP FOR THE ISLAND OF MAUI AND COUNCIL ADOPTED DIGITAL ZONING MAP 3 MARCH 18 AS THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP FOR THE ISLAND OF MAUI. BILL 66 (2022) INCORPORATES FURTHER REVISIONS IN MAP 3 INTO A NEW MAP 4. BY CORRESPONDING STATED MAY 19, 2022, THE CHAIR OF YOUR COMMITTEE TRANSMITTED A PROPOSED CD 1 VERSION OF BILL 66, INCORPORATING ZONING AMENDMENTS FOR 13 PARCELS TO P-2 OF THE QUASI-DISTRICT AND CORRECTING REFERENCES FROM DIGITAL ZONING MAP 3 TO MAP 4. YOUR COMMITTEE DISCUSSED REMOVING FOUR PARCELS FROM MAP 4, IN SOUTH MA EWI, INCLUDING KIHEI FIRE STATION WITH CONCERNS TO SEE-LEVEL RISE AND HOSPITAL AND KAMEHAMEHA SCHOOLS WITH BUILDING HEIGHTS AND AGREED THAT COMMUNITY INPUT ON THE ZONING OF SOUTH MAUI PARCELS SHOULD OCCUR IN THE PLAN UPDATE AND TO ADDRESS COMMUNITY CONCERNS WITH THE P-2 PUBLIC WASI PUBLIC DISTRICT LIMIT OF 90' BY PROPOSING A CHANGE IN ZONING OF 13 PARCELS TO P-1 PUBLIC/QUASI-PUBLIC DISTRICT HEIGHT LIMIT OF 40'. A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING SAID THE OTHER PROPERTIES IN ADDITION TO THE 13 PARCELS THAT ARE INCORRECTLY ZONED MAY NEED TO BE REMOVED ALL TOGETHER FROM THE P-2 PUBLIC/QUASI-PUBLIC DISTRICT AND RECOMMENDED BILL 66 BE FILED. YOUR COMMITTEE SUPPORTED IMPROVED CHANGES IN ZONING PROCEDURES INCLUDING BATCHING PARCELS FOR FUTURE COUNCIL CONSIDERATION AND PROMPT NOTIFICATION OF NEIGHBORS FOR COMMUNITY INPUT ON PROPOSED CHANGES IN ZONING. YOUR COMMITTEE VOTED 9-0 TO RECOMMEND FILING OF BILL 66 (2022) AND WE WERE GOING TO HOLD OFF UNTIL MS.\r\n\r\nOKI WAS READY TO DISCUSS HOW WE WOULD LIKE TO DO DIGITAL ZONING UPDATES IN THE FUTURE THE BALL IS IN THEIR COURT. THANK YOU. >> ANY MORE DISCUSSION, MEMBERS? IF NOT, THE MOTION IS TO FILE THIS ITEM. ALL THOSE IN FAVOR OF THE MOTION, RAISE YOUR HAND AND SAY AYE? >> AYE. >> NINE AYES, ZERO NOS, MOTION CARRIES.\r\n\r\nMADAM CLERK. >> AND LASTLY FROM YOUR BUDGET, FINANCE, AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE, COMMITTEE REPORT 22-89 RECOMMENDING THAT RESOLUTION 22-172 BE FILED. >> MEMBER PALTIN. >> OH, THANK YOU. JUST FOR THE RECORD, I'M WITH PSLU. AND THAT IS CR22-89. I MOVE TO ADOPT THE RECOMMENDATIONS IN COMMITTEE REPORT 22-9 FOR PSLU. >> SECOND.\r\n\r\n>> MOVED BY MEMBER PALTIN AND SECONDED BY PRO TEM KAMA TO APPROVE THE COMMITTEE REPORT'S RECOMMENDATIONS IN 22-89. DISCUSSION, MEMBER PALTIN. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. MOVE TO ADOPT THE RECOMMENDATION IN COMMITTEE REPORT 22-9. >> >> DISCUSSION IN NO DISCUSSION? >> YOUR PLANNING AND SUSTAINABLE LAND USE COMMITTEE MET ON AUGUST 18TH, 2022 TO DISCUSS RESOLUTION 22-172 ENTITLED". REFERRING TO THE PLANNING COMMISSIONS A PROPOSED BILL AMENDING THE CRITERIA FOR TRANSIENT VACATION RENTAL USE WITHIN THE A-1 AND A-2 APARTMENT DISTRICTS. RESOLUTIONS 22-172'S PURPOSE IS TO REFER TO THE PLANNING COMMISSIONS A PROPOSED BILL THAT AMENDS TRANSIENT VACATION RENTAL USE WITHIN A-1 AND A-2 APARTMENT DISTRICTS. YOUR COMMITTEE DISCUSSED AMENDING THE BILL TO CLARIFY THAT TRANSIENT VACATION RENTAL USE IS ALLOWED IN THE A-1 AND A-2 APARTMENT DISTRICTS ONLY IF OPERATING LAWFULLY WITH A PERMIT. THE PLANNING DIRECTOR SAID THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT IS NEW GIVEN THE COUNCIL'S ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION 22-154, WHICH REFERRED THE BILL CURRENTLY UNDER REVIEW BY THE PLANNING COMMISSIONS TO CONVERT FROM TRANSIENT VACATION RENTAL USE TO LONG-TERM RESIDENTIAL USE.\r\n\r\nYOUR COMMITTEE VOTED 9-0 TO RECOMMEND FILING OF RESOLUTION 22-172. >> MEMBERS, ANY MORE DISCUSSION? IF NOT, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR OF THE RESOLUTION, RAISE YOUR HAND AND SAY AYE? >> AYE. >> NINE AYES, ZERO NOS. MOTION CARRIES. MADAM CLERK. CHAIR, PROCEEDING WITH AGENDA ITEM K, RESOLUTIONS.\r\n\r\nWE HAVE SOME TESTIFIERS SIGNED UP, AND THE FIRST TESTIFIER FOR THIS AGENDA ITEM IS -- AGENDA ITEM CATEGORY IS GENESIS YOUNG, FOLLOWED BY SCOTT CRAWFORD. DR. YOUNG. IS HE STILL ON THE CALL? >> DR. CRAWFORD? >> YES.\r\n\r\nGOOD MORNING, AGAIN, MADAM CHAIR AND COUNCIL MEMBERS. I WANTED TO TESTIFY ON BEHALF OF KIPAHULU IN SUPPORT OF RESOLUTION 22-205 IN SUPPORT OF THIS DESIGNATION OF KIPAHULU MOKU. AS YOU PROBABLY KNOW THE COMMUNITY OF PEOPLE HAS BEEN WORKING ON THIS DESIGNATION PROPOSAL FOR TEN YEARS NOW. IT'S BEEN A LONG PROCESS, AND WE HAVE PUT A LOT OF EFFORT INTO COMMUNITY OUTREACH, AND GETTING INPUT OF FISHERS, AND TRADITIONAL PRACTITIONERS, AND RESOURCE USERS TO COME UP WITH WHAT WE FEEL IS A REALLY SOUND PROPOSAL FOR HAWAI'I STATE AND CULTURALLY-BASED RULES THAT WILL HELP PROTECT THE TRADITIONAL HAWAIIAN LIFESTYLE, AND THE RESOURCES OF THE MOKU. WE'LL BE ONLY THE THIRD COMMUNITY IN HAWAI'I TO BE DESIGNATED AS A CBSFA, FOLLOWING HA'ENA FIVE YEARS AGO AND ON THE BIG ISLAND, THAT RECENTLY GOT THEIR DESIGNATION. SO WE'RE AT THE VERY FINAL STAGE OF THE PROCESS NOW. WE'RE JUST ABOUT TO FINALIZE THE PACKAGE BASED ON ALL OF THE FEEDBACK THAT WE HAVE RECEIVED FROM ALL OF THE SCOPING MEETINGS AND STAKEHOLDER INPUT THAT WE HAVE RECEIVED WORKING WITH THAT TO FINALIZE THAT AND SEND IT OVER TO THE BOARD OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO ENTER INTO THE FORMAL ADMINISTRATIVE RULE MAKING PROCESS.\r\n\r\nWE HOPE TO DO THAT WITHIN THE NEXT FEW WEEKS, A COUPLE WEEKS, MAYBE? SO BECAUSE WITH THAT TIME-SENSITIVITY, WE WOULD

LIKE TO REQUEST THAT THE COUNCIL WAIVE COMMITTEE REFERRAL AND IF POSSIBLE, PASS THE RESOLUTION ON THE FLOOR. SO WE WOULD LOVE TO BE ABLE TO INCLUDE THIS IN THE PACKAGE THAT GOES TO THE BOARD OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES FOR THE RULE-MAKING PROCESS. I'M HAPPY TO ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS THAT ANYBODY HAS. WE REALLY APPRECIATE ALL OF THE WORK OF THE STAFF THAT PUT TOGETHER THIS RESOLUTION, AND COUNCIL MEMBER SINENCI'S OFFICE FOR BRINGING IT FORWARD ON BEHALF OF THE MAUI COMMUNITY, AND ALL OF THE SUPPORT OF THE COUNCIL MEMBERS. MAHALO. >> MEMBERS, QUESTIONS?\r\n\r\nPRO TEM KAMA. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. THANK YOU FOR BEING HERE TODAY. CAN YOU KIND OF WALK ME THROUGH WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE A COMMUNITY-BASED SUBSISTENCE FISHING AREA >> THANK YOU FOR THE QUESTION, MEMBER KAMA. THE STATE HAS A VARIETY OF DESIGNATIONS AND COMMUNITY-BASED SUBSISTENCE FISHING AREA IS UNIQUE IN THE FACT THAT IT'S REALLY IN SEVERAL RESPECTS. ONE, IT ENTERS WITH THE COMMUNITY AND DIVISION OF AQUATIC RESOURCES. SO THAT THE COMMUNITY HAS A REAL ACTIVE ROLE IN THE EDUCATION AND OUTREACH AROUND THE IMPLEMENTATION OF CBSFA AND IT'S UNIQUE IN THAT IT FOCUSES ON THE TRADITIONAL PRACTICES, TRADITIONAL AND CUSTOMARY PRACTICES OF THE AREA.\r\n\offnso that those practices exist in relation to the resources, AND THIS IS A WAY NOT JUST TO PRESERVE THE RESOURCES, BUT TO MAKE SURE THAT THE LIFESTYLE CAN ALSO BE PERPETUATED. IN A REMOTE AREA LIKE KIPAHULU, WHERE FAMILIES RELY ON A TRADITIONAL LIFESTYLE AND SUBSISTENCE ECONOMY, THIS IS VERY IMPORTANT. ONCE THIS IS PUT INTO PLACE, THERE WILL BE A SET OF RULES OR BASICALLY REGULATIONS THAT WILL BE PART OF STATE LAW, THAT WILL APPLY PARTICULARLY TO KIPAHULU, RELATED TO EVERYTHING FROM CERTAIN GEAR RESTRICTIONS, SIZE RESTRICTIONS, SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS, AND THINGS THAT WE FEEL ARE PROTECTIVE OF THE SPECIFIC ECOLOGY, AND RESOURCE SITUATION IN KIPAHULU. ONE THING I WANT TO EMPHASIZE IS EVEN THOUGH THE RULES AND REGULATIONS WILL BE IN PLACE, EMPHASIS, YOU KNOW, FROM BOTH OUR TO COMPLY, BECAUSE THEY UNDERSTAND THAT IS THE PONO, THE RIGHT THING TO DO TO MAKE SURE THAT THE LIFESTYLE AND RESOURCES CAN BE MAINTAINED NOT OUT OF FEAR OF ENFORCEMENT, BUT HAVING THE RULES IN PLACE WILL BE HELPFUL. SO IF THERE'S REALLY ABUSE OF THE SYSTEM, BUT OUTREACH AND COMPLIANCE, BECAUSE PEOPLE UNDERSTAND THE REASONS BEHIND THE RULES WILL BE THE EFFORT OF THE KIPAHULU 'OHANA. SO HOPE THAT ANSWERS YOUR QUESTION, AT LEAST SOMEWHAT. >> IT DOES.\r\n\r\nSO I JUST -- ONE LAST QUESTION. SO DO YOU HAVE AN OUTREACH PROGRAM WITH THAT? >> YES. DEFINITELY. I MEAN, WE HAVE BEEN DOING OUTREACH FOR THE LAST -- FOR MANY YEARS AROUND THIS. WE HAVE WHAT IS CALLED AN ADMINISTRATIVE RECORD THAT ACTUALLY DOCUMENTS ALL OF OUR OUTREACH AND IT'S MANY, MANY PAGES LONG, GOING BACK MANY YEARS, AS PART OF THE MANAGEMENT PLAN THAT WILL BE BROUGHT TO THE BLNR, YOU KNOW, THE OUTREACH WILL BE A CRITICAL PART OF THAT. WE'LL BE WORKING WITH HIGH WATCH PROGRAM AND DEVELOPING SIGNAGE AND OUTREACH MATERIALS AND JUST REALLY CONTINUING OUR SOCIAL MEDIA CAMPAIGNING, AND HAVING A PRESENCE THERE ON THE SHORELINE.\r\n\r\nSO THAT WE CAN CONNECT WITH THE FISHERMEN AND USERS. SO THEY UNDERSTAND THE REASONS WHY THIS IS IN PLACE, AND REALLY WANT TO BE A PART OF IT. >> THANK YOU. THANK YOU, CHAIR. >> ANY MORE QUESTIONS? IF NOT, MR. CRAWFORD, I DO HAVE A QUESTION.\r\nWHY WOULDN'T YOU WANT THE REST OF OUR RESIDENTS, TO GIVE THEM AN OPPORTUNITY TO WEIGH-IN ON THE PROPOSAL? WE HAVE PEOPLE WHO FISH ALL OVER. >> YEAH, WELL JUST TO CLARIFY, THE RULES APPLY TO EVERYONE EQUALLY. SO THIS DOESN'T RESTRICT ANYONE FROM FISHING IN KIPAHULU. IT JUST PUTS CERTAIN RULES IN PLACE FOR ALL OF THE USERS. THROUGHOUT THE PROCESS, WE HAVE SEVERAL MEETINGS, WITH FISHERMEN FROM OTHER PARTS OF MAUI FOR INPUT. WE HAD MADE SOME ADJUSTMENTS TO THE RULES PACKAGE BASED ON THE FEEDBACK

RECEIVED FROM THEM, WITH GOOD SUGGESTIONS MOVING FORWARD.\r\n\r\nSO WE HAVE WELCOMED AND WE'LL CONTINUE TO WELCOME INPUT FROM ALL OF THE USERS. >> I JUST WONDERED, YOU SAY YOU WELCOMED INPUT FROM ALL OF THE USERS, BUT I WOULD IMAGINE MANY OF THEM DON'T EVEN KNOW ABOUT THIS, BECAUSE WE'RE LEARNING ABOUT THIS NOW; RIGHT? >> WELL, I -- YOU KNOW, I JUST SAY WE HAVE DONE A LOT OF OUTREACH, YOU KNOW? THROUGH WORKING WITH DOFAW, WE HAVE IN 2021, KIPAHULU 'OHANA HOSTED THREE SCOPING MEETINGS, AS WELL AS INDIVIDUAL TALK-STORY SESSIONS WITH FISHERMEN, AND IN EARLY JUNE THIS YEAR, THE DIVISION OF AQUATIC RESOURCES SCOPING MEETING AND WE MADE A POINT TO DO OUTREACH THROUGH THE CAPTAIN'S CLUB, PUTTING FLIERS UP AT THE FISHING SHOPS AND SPORTING GOODS STORES, GOING THROUGH VARIOUS CONNECTIONS TO GET THE WORD OUT TO LOCAL FISHERMEN AND WE DID HAVE PARTICIPATION IN ALL MEETINGS FROM FISHERMEN FROM SOUTH MAUI AND CENTRAL MAUI FOR THEIR INPUT INTO THE PROCESS. >> THANK YOU. >> TO GET THEIR INPUT, AND I THINK WE HAVE INCORPORATED A LOT. >> THANK YOU.\r\n\r\nMEMBERS, ANY MORE QUESTIONS? THANK YOU, MR. CRAWFORD. MEMBER PALTIN HAS A QUESTION. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. IT'S NOT NECESSARILY A QUESTION, BECAUSE I'M SUPER FAMILIAR WITH CBSFAS, AND IN SUPPORT OF THEM. I JUST WAS WONDERING IF MR.\r\n\r\nCRAWFORD WANTED TO BE A RESOURCE WHEN THIS ITEM COMES UP? >> THANK YOU, MEMBER PALTIN. I WOULD BE HAPPY TO STAY ON AND SERVE AS A RESOURCE, IF THE CHAIR WOULD LIKE. >> MEMBERS ANY OBJECTIONS TO HAVING MR. CRAWFORD BE A RESOURCE WHEN THIS MATTER COMES UP? >> NO OBJECTIONS. >> NO OBJECTIONS, SO ORDERED.\r\n\r\nVICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ. >> MAHALO, CHAIR. THERE'S AN ECHO. MR. CRAWFORD, AS A RESOURCE PERSON IN CASE SOMETIMES WE DO ASK PEOPLE TO SERVE AS RESOURCE PEOPLE AND NO ONE HAS QUESTIONS. SO JUST REAL QUICKLY WANTED TO ASK MR. CRAWFORD FOR THE DATE AGAIN FOR THE PACKAGE THAT YOU NEEDED TO BE INCLUDED?\r\n\r\n>> WE DON'T HAVE A SET DATE AT THIS TIME, BUT WE'RE WORKING TO FINALIZE IT WITHIN HOPEFULLY THE NEXT WEEK OR TWO. WE'RE REALLY AT THAT FINAL STAGE OF KEEPING -- GETTING READY TO SUBMIT TO THE DLNR. SO HOPEFULLY WITHIN THE NEXT COUPLE OF WEEKS. >> AWESOME. MAHALO, CHAIR. >> ANY MORE QUESTIONS, MEMBERS? IF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH.\r\n\r\nWE'LL TALK TO YOU IN A FEW MINUTES, HOPEFULLY, AGAIN. ANY MORE TESTIFIERS? >> YES, CHAIR. WE'LL CIRCLE BACK AROUND TO DR. GENESIS YOUNG, AND DR. GENESIS YOUNG IS FOLLOWED BY CLAUDIA KALAOLA. >> ALOHA.\r\n\r\nCAN YOU HEAR ME? >> YES, WE CAN. >> GREAT. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. I DO FIND THIS METHOD OF TESTIFYING OBJECTIONABLE TO OUR TIME AND NOT VERY RESPECTIVE TO THE TIME OF THE CITIZENS OF THIS COMMUNITY THAT YOU ARE SERVING. SO I JUST WANT TO HAVE THAT REGISTERED. I'M IN SUPPORT OF RESOLUTION 22-206. I THINK WE REALLY NEED TO USE EMINENT DOMAIN IN THIS CASE, AS APPARENTLY, SOME OF THE NEGOTIATIONS TO PROTECT OUR WATERSHED, AND REALLY WATERSHED AND WATER ARE REALLY VERY, VERY HIGH-PRIORITY FOR THE HEALTH OF OUR ENVIRONMENT, WHICH AFFECTS THE HEALTH OF HUMANS, WHICH EFFECTS THE HEALTH OF COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY AND IF THERE'S EVER A TIME TO USE EMINENT DOMAIN FOR THIS PURCHASE.\r\n\r\nTHEY HAVE TO DO EVERYTHING OUT IN THE OPEN AND IT'S TIME TO INVOKE EMINENT DOMAIN. THAT IS STILL A FAIR PROCESS AND NO FAIRER WHAT HAS BEEN GOING ON, BECAUSE WITH EMINENT DOMAIN BEING USED, YOU'LL BE ABLE TO SECURE THE LAND AT FAIR MARKET PRICE WITH PUBLIC NEGOTIATION WITHOUT THE ABILITY TO GAIN BEHIND-THE-SCENES. SO I REALLY WANT TO SUPPORT THIS RESOLUTION AND BRING IT FORWARD. I KNOW EMINENT DOMAIN IS SOMETHING THAT PEOPLE DON'T WANT TO FORCE PEOPLE IN GENERAL TO FORCE PEOPLE, BUT EVER A TIME TO USE IT IS NOW. THANK YOU FOR THE RESOLUTION AND FOR ALL OF THE WORK FOR WATERSHED PROTECTION. WATER IS LIFE AS DAVID DORN SAID EARLIER. I WANT TO THANK YOU ALL THE WORK FOR PUTTING THIS FORWARD.\r\n\r\nI THINK IT'S IMPORTANT, AND THERE'S A TIME, AND PLACE FOR EVERYTHING AND THIS IS THE TIME AND PLACE IN MY OPINION. SO I'M COMPLETE. THANK YOU. >> THANK YOU, DR. YOUNG. ANY QUESTIONS FOR THE TESTIFIER? IF NOT, MAY WE HAVE THE NEXT TESTIFIER.\r\n\r>> OUR NEXT TESTIFIER IS CLAUDIA KALAOLA, FOLLOWED BY DAVID DORN. >> ALOHA, CLAUDIA KALAOLA, PRESENTING ALOHA KAKAHIAKA KAKOU, COUNCIL MEMBERS, ECHOING COUNCIL MEMBER SINENCI'S TO OUR KALALANI. TODAY I'M TESTIFYING IN OPPORTUNITY OF RESOLUTION 22-205 IN SUPPORT OF A COMMUNITY-BASED SUBSISTENCE FISHING AREA DESIGNATION. AS A CULTURAL PRACTITIONER, WHO HAS BEEN INVOLVED IN COMMUNITY-BASED RESOURCE MANAGEMENT FOR ABOUT 20 YEARS, I PERSONALLY WITNESSED ALL OF THE GOOD WORKS THAT HAS BEEN ACCOMPLISHED OVER THE YEARS. I'M PARTICULARLY IMPRESSED WITH THE LEADERSHIP ROLE OF JOHN LIND, WHO RECENTLY PASSED AND HOW HE MENTORED AND TAUGHT HUNDREDS THE IMPORTANCE OF LEADERSHIP IN THE MANAGEMENT OF MAUKA TO MAKAI. HIS PASSING IS SAD, BUT THE BLESSING IS THAT HE HAD THE KNOWLEDGE PASSED ON TO HIS SONS AND OTHERS WITHIN THE 'OHANA, WHO LIVE IN THE MOKU. COMMUNITY-BASED SUBSISTENCE FISHING AREAS HAVE DEMONSTRATED IMPACT AS A STRONG PLATFORM FOR COMMUNITIES AND THE STATE TO STEWARD NEARSHORE OBSERVE AREAS AND NATURAL/CULTURAL AREAS.\r\n\r\nCBSFAS HAVE RECEIVED INTERNATIONAL RECOGNITION AS GLOBALLY APPLICABLE SOLUTIONS BY THE INTERNATIONAL UNION FOR CONSERVATION OF NATURE IUCN AND DEVELOPMENT OF THE EQUATOR PRIZE, WHICH WAS AWARDED [SPEAKER NOT UNDERSTOOD] I BELIEVE THE FUNDAMENTAL ASPECT OF SUBSISTENCE AND CULTURAL PRACTICE ARE INFORMED BY OBSERVATIONS AND PRACTICES OF TRADITIONAL NOTIONS OF PLACE. THE PROCESS HONORS AND RESPECTS THE OPINIONS AND EXPERIENCES OF COMMUNITY MEMBERS. PEOPLE MOKU REQUEST FOR DESIGNATION REAFFIRMS AND PROTECTING FISHING PRACTICES CUSTOMARILY AND TRADITIONALLY EXERCISED FOR THE NATIVE HAWAIIAN SUBSISTENCE AND CULTURE AND RELIGION OF MANY OF OUR CULTURAL PRACTICES, TRADITIONAL FOODS, WATER RIGHTS, GATHERING RIGHTS, AND RESOURCES ARE BEING DISREGARDED, UNAPPRECIATED AND OFTEN MISUNDERSTOOD. AS KANAKA MAOLI, MY 'OHANA AND I HAVE LIVED TO SEEN THE ABUNDANCE EVERY LIGHT ON AND CONTINUE TO RELY ON FISHING AND GATHERING OF MARINE RESOURCES FOR OUR SUBSISTENCE AND WELL-BEING. A HEALTHY AND RESILIENT FISHERY IS VITAL TO ASSURING OUR PRACTICES TO CONTINUE FOR CURRENT AND FUTURE GENERATIONS. PLEASE HELP US TO CARRY FORWARD THE WORK AND EFFORTS OF THE MOKU BY SUPPORTING ONLY STATE-APPROVED MANAGEMENT PLAN THAT ALLOWS THE INCORPORATION OF I KE KAI. ALOHA.\r\n\r\n>> THANK YOU. QUESTIONS, MEMBERS? NO QUESTIONS. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. >> MAHALO. >> MADAM CLERK. >> OUR NEXT TESTIFIER -- >> HOW MANY DO WE HAVE?\r\n\r\nBECAUSE IT'S TIME FOR OUR MORNING BREAK. >> THERE ARE CURRENTLY SIX TESTIFIERS SIGNED UP. >> MEMBERS, IT'S TIME FOR OUR BREAK. IT'S 10:38. SO TEN-MINUTE BREAK AND COME BACK. ANY OBJECTIONS SO TO THAT? SO ORDERED. WE'LL BE IN RECESS FOR TEN MINUTES UNTIL 10:48. [ GAVEL ] [ GAVEL ] >> WILL THE COUNCIL MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 2ND, PLEASE RECONVENE.\r\n\r\nSHALL WE CONTINUE WITH TESTIMONY, MADAM CLERK. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. CONTINUING WITH CATEGORY K, RESOLUTIONS. WE HAVE MR. DAVID DORN, TO BE FOLLOWED BY MIKE MORAN. >> ALOHA, COUNCIL MEMBERS AGAIN. MY NAME IS DAVID DORN.\r\n\r\nI'M NOT A LOBBYIST AND SPEAKING TODAY ON SIERRA CLUB MAUI AND SUPPORT 22-206 AUTHORIZING PROCEEDINGS AND IMPLEMENTING THE ACQUISITION OF APPROXIMATELY 257 ACRES AT MA'ALAEA MAUKA/POHAKEA WATERSHEDS NECESSARY TO PREVENT DEGRADATION AND PROTECT THE ENVIRONMENT AND AT-RISK NATURAL REEF AND FISHING GROUNDS AND THE WHALE SANCTUARY WATERS. I FELT COMPELLED TO SPEAK TODAY ON BEHALF OF THE 5,000 ACRES WATERSHED, EPHEMERAL STREAMS AND CORAL REEF AND MARINE ENVIRONMENT.

WATERSHEDS ARE LIVING SYSTEMS THAT NEED TO BE LOOKED AT IN THEIR ENTIRETY. DEVELOPERS TEND TO LOOK AT PROJECTS ON A PIECE BY PIECE BASIS. BUT IF YOU LOOK AT THIS BACKGROUND YOU CAN SEE HERE THERE'S EXTENSIVE 3400 ACRES OF STATE-OWNED WATERSHED IMMEDIATELY ABOVE THIS PARCEL RUNNING THROUGH THIS AREA IS APPROXIMATELY FIVE EPHEMERAL STREAMS AND IF IGNORED THEY WILL CREATE MASSIVE PROBLEMS FOR NEARSHORE WATERS AND REEF HAS LOST LIVING ORGANISMS IN THE PAST SEVERAL DECADES. SO I THINK IT'S VITAL THAT WE SUPPORT THIS EFFORT TO PROTECT OUR ENTIRE -- THIS IMPORTANT WATERSHED, AND THE ENVIRONMENT FROM UNNECESSARY DESTRUCTION. SO THESE SUPPORT THIS EFFORT TO ACOUIRE THIS PROPERTY THROUGH EMINENT DOMAIN.\r\n\r\n>> THANK YOU. MEMBERS, ANY QUESTIONS? THANK YOU VERY MUCH. MAY WE HAVE THE NEXT TESTIFIER. >> OUR NEXT TESTIFIER IS MIKE MORAN, TO BE FOLLOWED BY [SPEAKER NOT UNDERSTOOD] >> MAHALO, AGAIN, CHAIR, FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO TESTIFY. CHAIR, I THINK I CAN GO OUT ON A LIMB AND SAY THAT I DON'T BELIEVE THERE'S ANY COUNCIL MEMBER OR PARTICIPANT WHO LIKES THIS NEW SYSTEM. WE HAVE AGREEMENT, BUT I THINK THAT THE COUNCIL IS DOING EVERYTHING YOU CAN DO UNDER THESE CIRCUMSTANCES.\r\n\r\nIF ANYBODY HAS A BETTER WAY TO FIX IT, HOPEFULLY THEY WILL STEP UP. HSAC IS AN ATTEMPT TO DO SOMETHING, AND THAT IS SEEMINGLY THE ONLY ACTION YOU CAN TAKE. SO WE COMPLETELY UNDERSTAND IT AND COMMISERATE WITH ALL OF US IN THIS SAME SITUATION. WE'RE IN SUPPORT OF 22-206, AND I THINK GENERAL AGREEMENT THAT EMINENT DOMAIN IS NOT SOMETHING YOU DO LIGHTLY. I THINK IT'S PRETTY RARE WHEN IT'S USED, BUT WE CERTAINLY SUPPORT IT IN THIS INSTANCE. WE HAVE SEEN FOR YEARS, ATTEMPTS TO DEVELOP THESE LANDS BY DIFFERENT DEVELOPERS, AND WE THOUGHT WE HAD A WAY OUT TO PREVENT IT, AND GET CLOSE TO THE FINISH LINE, I KEEP USING THAT EXPRESSION, AND IT DOESN'T WORK. SO WE ARE IN SUPPORT OF THIS ACTION FOR MA'ALAEA BAY IS HANGING ON, AND ANY ACTION WE CAN TAKE TO START TO TURN THE TIDE, AND PRESERVE IT, WE THINK IS CERTAINLY JUSTIFIED.\r\n\r\nSO WE ARE IN COMPLETE SUPPORT OF THIS MATTER BEFORE YOU TODAY, 22-206. MAHALO FOR THE OPPORTUNITY. >> THANK YOU, MR. MORAN. ANY QUESTIONS, MEMBERS? IF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH. NEXT TESTIFIER. >> OUR NEXT TESTIFIER IS KAL WIKI, FOLLOWED BY LUCIENNE DE NAIE.\r\n\r\n>> HI COUNCIL MEMBERS. HONORABLE COUNCIL MEMBERS, ALOHA. MY NAME IS KAL WIKI LYNN, FROM HANA, MAUI, RAISED IN THE VALLEY. MY PARENTS WERE BORN IN THE TERRITORY, AS WELL AS MY GRANDMOTHER, WHO IS 92. RAISED BY THEIR MOTHER -- I'M HERE NOT ONLY BECAUSE OF THE SECTION 5 RESPONSIBILITY. SORRY, THIS IS IN TESTIMONY WITH THE KIPAHULU RESOLUTION, THE COUNTY COULD SUPPORT THE KIPAHULU RESOLUTION CBSFA. THE REASON WHY WE WENT PARTICULARLY DOWN THIS ROAD, WHY THE COMMUNITY IS, YOU CAN SEE THE PICTURE BEHIND ME FROM COMMERCIAL BOATERS WHO SNATCH UP THE NEWCOMERS, THE FISH. LIKE A METAPHOR THE FISH THAT CAME INTO THE BAY AND SURROUNDED BY THE COMMUNITY WITH HUKILAU.\r\n\r\nWHILE THESE BOATS ARE GOING AROUND THE STATE AND EXTRACTING THE BALLS FROM AROUND THE STATE, AND THERE WERE ENTITLED TO IT, BECAUSE OF THE FISHING REGULATIONS. SO 1992, I THINK IT WAS GOVERNOR WAIAHAI ALLOWED THE PROCESS WHERE YOU COULD CHANGE THE RULES. OUR PROPOSED RULES WERE NON-COMMERCIAL TAKE, PREVENTING THE FISHERMEN FROM COMING INTO THE VALLEY AND TAKING OUR EHA FROM OUR COMMUNITY. BECAUSE I THINK WE'RE ONE OF THE FEW COMMUNITIES ACROSS THE STATE THAT PRACTICES COMMUNITY SHARING, WHICH IS AN ANCIENT PROCESS OF DIVIDING THE CATCH. WHERE WE GO OUT AND SURROUND AKULE AND IT'S NOT SOMETHING GUARANTIED. YOU KNOW, FISHING IS LIKE GAMBLING. FOR THOSE WHO DON'T KNOW ABOUT THE CBSFA, WE HAVE BEEN WORKING ON IT FOR QUITE SOME TIME NOW.\r\n\r\nBUT NOT ONLY TO STICK WITH THE DLNR, THEY ARE THE ONES WHO THE BLNR TO HAVE IT PASSED UNANIMOUSLY BY THE BOARD SEVERAL WEEKS

AGO. SO ANOTHER THING I WOULD LIKE TO BRING UP IS THE 30X30 INITIATIVE. HAWAIIAN MANA'O ABOUT THE LAWS REGARDING THE NATIVE POPULATION, BUT ALSO GOVERNOR IGE'S 30X30 INITIATIVE, WHICH IS SET ASIDE 30% OF THE STATE OF HAWAI'I FOR CONSERVATION PURPOSES. SO THIS ALSO FALLS WITH PRESIDENT BIDEN/HARRIS ADMINISTRATION. SO WE HAD SUPPORT BY THE NATIONAL PARK SERVICE, THE NATURE CONSERVANCY, MAJORITY SUPPORT OF THE KIPAHULU COMMUNITY. I'M HERE TO ASK FOR SUPPORT FOR RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT THE KIPAHULU APPLICATION FOR THE CBSFA. THANK YOU.\r\n\r\n>> THANK YOU. QUESTIONS, MEMBERS? PRO TEM KAMA. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. THANK YOU FOR BEING HERE, MR. LYNN. SO MY QUESTION IS, YOU MENTIONED IN YOUR TESTIMONY THAT THE FISHING WOULD ALSO BE ALLOWED BY PROBABLY THE PEOPLE THEMSELVES, INDIVIDUALS, BUT NOT COMMERCIAL FISHING, IS THAT CORRECT?\r\n\r\n>> OUR PROPOSED MANAGEMENT RULES, YEAH. FISHING, YOU CAN'T -- YEAH, IT WILL PREVENT -- IF PASSED BY BLNR NON-COMMERCIAL TAKE OF AKULE AND OTHER SPECIES WE'RE PLANNING ON EXTENDING THE -- RIGHT NOW THE CURRENT RULES BY THE STATE IS MAY-SEPTEMBER. SO EVERYBODY IS HITTING THE OCEAN RIGHT NOW, TODAY IS SEPTEMBER 2ND, WITH LOBSTER SEASON JUST OPENING AND I CAN IMAGINE ALL OF THE FAMILIES ACROSS THE STATE ARE TAKING ADVANTAGE, IF THEY ARE NOT POACHING TO GO AHEAD AND TAKE THE LOBSTERS. SO YOU KNOW, COUNCIL MEMBER TASHA KAMA, WE HAD DRAWBACKS FROM THE COMMUNITY, NOT SO MUCH IN EAST MAUI, BUT OUTSIDE, BUT THOUGHT THE RULES AND REGULATIONS BAG LIMITS WAS NOT SHARED. THEY DIDN'T HAVE THE SAME SYSTEM/BELIEF. BUT THIS IS WHAT WE CAME UP, 40 PER PERSON PER DAY AND THE STATE DOESN'T HAVE A LIMIT ON PILLI. SO WE'RE ASKING THE PEOPLE WHO DO COME AND FISH IN KIPAHULU, TO IF IT'S PASSED BY BLNR AND RIGHT NOW THERE'S NO REGULATIONS, SO PEOPLE ARE ALLOWED TO COME IN AND FISH AND TAKE.\r\n\r\nYOU KNOW, IT'S THEIR RIGHT UNDER GOD, I GUESS. SO IF YOU GO ON OUR WEBSITE, YOU CAN SEE ALL THE PROPOSED RULES WE CAME UP IT'S IN THE HANDS OF DLNR TO COME BACK AND GIVE AND TAKE CERTAIN THINGS. >> WHAT IS THE NAME OF YOUR WEBSITE? >> WE WORKED WITH THE KIPAHULU COMMUNITY TO APPLY FOR THE PROCESS. KIPAHULU.ORG AND FOR KALANI -- I BELIEVE THEY HAD PROBLEMS WITH THE AQUARIUM TRADE IN KONA. IN HANA, WE HAVE ROUGH SEAS. IT'S NOT SOMETHING YOU WANT TO TAKE LIGHTLY AND I ALSO RUN WITH THE NATURE CONSERVANCY, A CREEL SURVEY TO SEE WHO IS USING THE OCEAN?\r\n\r\nSO THE SURVEY WILL BE AVAILABLE AS SOON AS THE SCIENTISTS COME BACK WITH IT. WE WORRY ABOUT POACHING AT NIGHT AND WHY WE'RE TAKING THIS WAY. >> THANK YOU. THANK YOU, CHAIR. >> MEMBER KING, DID I SEE YOUR HAND UP? MEMBER KING. >> YES.\r\n\r\nI HAVE A COUPLE OF QUESTIONS FOR MR. LYNN. I DON'T KNOW, DO WE WANT ASK HIM TO BE A RESOURCE PERSON WHEN WE GET TO THIS ITEM, SINCE IT LOOKS LIKE WE'RE DISCUSSING THIS ON THE FLOOR, OR CAN WE ASK QUESTIONS NOW, CHAIR? >> YOU CAN ASK QUESTIONS NOW. >> THANK YOU SO MUCH FOR BEING HERE. YOUR TESTIMONY WAS REALLY GOOD, BECAUSE IT EXPLAINED A LOT MORE THE DETAIL OF WHY THIS IS HAPPENING, AND WHY WE WANT TO MOVE FORWARD. I UNDERSTAND THAT YOU HAVE SOME PROPOSED RULES THAT YOU ARE GOING TO BE PUTTING IN FRONT OF DLNR.\r\nARE THEY GOING TO BE THE ENFORCERS? WHO IS GOING TO ENFORCE THE RULES, ONCE THEY DO GET ACCEPTED? >> IF IT BECOMES LAW, DLNR CAN ENFORCE IT; WILL ENFORCE IT. THE IDEA, THE FACT OF THE MATTER IS WE TRY TO RELY ON THE COMMUNITY, YOU KNOW? DLNR IT WILL BE SELF-REGULATED RIGHT NOW AND THAT IS THE QUESTION PROPOSED TOWARDS THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES. WHO IS GOING TO MANAGE IT? THAT IS PART OF OUR MANAGEMENT PLAN, SOUTH MANAGEMENT COMMUNITY WATCH.\r\n\r\nYOU KNOW, THINGS LIKE THAT MATTER. >> BUT THE COMMUNITY IS NOT AUTHORIZED TO LEVY FINES. >> NO, NO. >> IT'S BASICALLY YOU HAVE TO REPORT IT, BUT WILL YOU BE REPORTING TO DLNR OR DOBOR? >> DLNR HAS AN APP

TO REPORT FISHING. I THINK FOR OUR COMMUNITY, MY FAMILY, I THINK WE DON'T WANT TO GO DOWN THAT ROAD AND ENGAGE IN THAT, YOU KNOW? BUT I KNOW IT BECOMES DLNR -- THE RANGERS CAN ENFORCE IT.\r\n\r\n>> >> SO DLNR WOULD BE RESPONSIBLE FOR IT. >> WE WOULD LIKE TO SEE MORE PRESENCE WITH DLNR, BUT IF THEY ARE UNDERFUNDED, BUT MAYBE IN THE FUTURE LIKE THE STATE HOUSING FOR TEACHERS IN HANA, AND ALSO FOR THAT PURPOSES, STATE LANDS IN HANA FOR DLNR FUNCTIONS. >> THE BODY THAT YOU ARE PROPOSING IN THIS RESOLUTION TO WRITE THE RULES HAS ALREADY WRITTEN THEM. SO THAT IS WHAT HAS GONE OUT TO THE PUBLIC? THERE WAS MENTION IN THE RESOLUTION THAT THERE'S BEEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ABOUT THIS. WERE THOSE RULES DISCUSSED? >> THE DLNR TOOK MOST OF OUR RULES AND THEY CAME BACK AND SAID -- I SPOKE WITH THE CBSFA MANAGER THAT FAMILIES WEREN'T -- INDIVIDUALS, STAKEHOLDERS, THE DUE PROCESS, BECAUSE THIS IS HOW THE PROCESS -- WE HAD TO HEAR FROM OTHER STAKEHOLDERS THAT THEY WEREN'T OKAY WITH THE CLOSURE OF THE CBSFA AT THE BAY, DOWN TO WHERE THE CAMPGROUND IS.\r\n\r\nTHERE WAS PUSH-BACK, BECAUSE WE FELT AS A COMMUNITY THAT ACCESS IS LIMITED SOMEWHAT ENTITLED TO NATIVE HAWAIIANS WHO HAVE BEEN USING THE AREA FOR SO LONG. SO PEOPLE NON-HAWAIIANS ESPECIALLY FELT THAT BECAUSE IT'S FOR EVERYBODY, THEY SHOULD BE USING THE KUKUI BAY. SO WE HAD TO REDRAW THE MAPS THAT THE GPS POINTS TO PUSH THE BOUNDARY FURTHER IN. SO THEY COULD HAVE ACCESS TO THE BAY. SO WE HAD TO KIND OF, LIKE, NEGOTIATE. >> THANK YOU. THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR YOUR ANSWER, BECAUSE WE'RE ON A TIME SCHEDULE TODAY.\r\n\r\nANY MORE QUESTIONS? YES, MEMBER MOLINA AND VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ. >> OH, NO, CHAIR. I DIDN'T HAVE A QUESTION FOR MR. LYNN, BUT A PROCEDURAL QUESTION. I WILL WAIT FOR AFTER THE OTHER MEMBERS ASK QUESTIONS. >> VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ.\r\n\r\n>> MAHALO, CHAIR. MAHALO, MR. LYNN, FOR YOUR TESTIMONY TODAY. I ATTENDED SEVERAL OF YOUR FOLKS' CBSFA MEETINGS AND FELT THAT THE INCORPORATION OF THE FEEDBACK FROM PRIMARILY NON-EAST MAUI RESIDENTS THAT TAKE FROM THOSE AREAS WAS REALLY WELL-DONE IN FINDING THAT COMMON GROUND. SO YOU SAID THAT THE RULES INCLUDE 40 OPIHI. IS THAT PER PERSON PER DAY? >> YES, 40, IF PASSED, YES.\r\n\r\n40 PER PERSON PER DAY. >> GENERALLY FISHERMEN GO IN GROUPS, WHICH THEY SHOULD, TO BE SAFE. WOULD TAKE 5-10. SO IT WOULD BE 200-400 OPIHI IN ONE DAY ALONE. >> YES. ESPECIALLY WITH LUAU SEASON AND HAWAIIAN FAMILIES GATHERING TO THE SIZE. >> I THINK THAT IS MORE THAN GENEROUS . SO YOU WERE ASKED ABOUT ENFORCEMENT. DO YOU PLAN TO CONTINUE TO DO ENFORCEMENT LIKE YOU FOLKS HAVE BEEN, WHICH IS PRIMARILY THROUGH EDUCATION?\r\n\r\n>> CORRECT. >> IN TEACHING THOSE THAT GATHER THERE, IT'S NOT ABOUT FINING OR PENALIZING PEOPLE, BUT IT'S ABOUT SHARING THROUGH EDUCATION, ON HOW TO PROPERLY GATHER. SO THEY ARE NOT HARMING THE RESOURCES THERE FOR GENERATIONS TO COME. >> YES. YES, OF COURSE. YOU KNOW, FOR INSTANCE, I THINK ONE OF THE LAWS BANNING AKULI CATCH, AND WE SHARED WITH COUPLE OUTSIDERS, THEY ARE HAWAIIAN FAMILIES FROM OUTSIDE. THEY IMMEDIATELY PUT IT ON THEIR DRONE AND FLEW IT OUT FOR THE LUAU, AND AMBER JACKS WERE ATTACKING THE SCHOOLS.\r\n\r\nWE RELY ON FOR INSTANCE WE PUT A LIMIT ON ONE. PEOPLE DIDN'T LIKE THAT. BECAUSE WE DEPEND ON THE COWBOYS OF THE SEA, I GUESS, BY THE KUPUNAS TO BRING IN THE FISH, BECAUSE THEY ARE CHASING THE SMALLER FISHES. SO EDUCATION IS IMPORTANT, AND WE ARE WILLING TO SHARE THAT WITH THE COMMUNITY OF MAUI, AND THE STATE, AND THE WORLD, BECAUSE YOU KNOW, ESSENTIALLY, EVENTUALLY THEY END UP AT THE NATIONAL PARK CAMPSITE. >> MAHALO, THE LAST QUESTION IS REGARDING ENFORCEMENT AGAIN. SO THESE OUTSIDE BOATS THAT COME IN SOMETIMES FROM OFF-ISLAND, MAYBE O'AHU, WOULD COME IN AND THEY HAVE A REGISTRATION TAG. WOULD YOU THEN TAKE A PICTURE OF THE REGISTRATION NUMBER AND PROVIDE THAT TO THE DOCARE OFFICERS IF

THEY ARE BLATANTLY DISREGARDING THE RULES IN THAT AREA?\r\n\r\n>> WE DON'T KNOW WHAT THEY ARE DOING. WE KNOW THEY ARE FISHING FOR SURE, BUT WE CAN'T SAY WHAT FISH THEY ARE CATCHING. SO RIGHT NOW, WE HAVE BEEN TRACKING ONE BOAT, I THINK, PRIOR HE HAD GOTTEN INTO TROUBLE FOR FISHING IN RESTRICTED AREAS. WE CAN'T MAKE THE DETERMINATION WITH OUR CURRENT CREEL SURVEY. SO BASICALLY WE DON'T KNOW WHAT THEY ARE DOING, EXCEPT THEY ARE FISHING. IF THEY ARE VISIBLE, THEIR NUMBERS, TOO. >> MAHALO, MR.\r\n\r\nLYNN. CHAIR, I DON'T KNOW IF MEMBERS, AS WE ASKED MR. CRAWFORD, IF HE WOULD SERVE AS A RESOURCE PERSON, PERHAPS WE CAN EXTEND THAT SAME INVITATION TO HIS OBVIOUS EXPERTISE IN THIS AREA? MAHALO, CHAIR. >> OBJECTIONS, MEMBERS? >> NO OBJECTIONS. >> CAN YOU COME BACK LATER WHEN WE DISCUSS THIS ITEM?\r\n\r\n>> YES, I CAN. ALOHA. YES. >> OKAY. BY THE WAY, YOUR GRANDMA IS DAISY? >> YES. SHE IS 93. >> 93. >> YES.\r\n\r\n>> TELL HER I SAY HI. >> THANK YOU. ALL RIGHT, ANY MORE TESTIFIERS? MADAM CLERK? >> YES, CHAIR. OUR NEXT TESTIFIER IS LUCIENNE DE NAIE MS. DE NAIE.\r\n\r\n>> GOOD MORNING, CHAIR. GOOD MORNING, COUNCIL MEMBERS. THANKS FOR THIS OPPORTUNITY TO TESTIFY ON THESE TWO IMPORTANT ITEMS. FIRST, THE COMMUNITY-BASED SUBSISTENCE FISHING AREAS, OF YOU MAY KNOW I'M INVOLVED WITH THE MAUI NUI RESOURCE COUNCIL, SERVING AS IT'S VICE PRESIDENT AND ONE OF THE ORIGINAL FOUNDERS. THIS CONCEPT WAS SOMETHING THAT WAS BROUGHT TO OUR ATTENTION IN OUR FIRST YEAR OF EXISTENCE. WE SCROUNGED TOGETHER SOME MONEY TO LEARN HOW THEY WERE ACTUALLY PUTTING COMMUNITY-BASED SUBSISTENCE FISHING AREA MANAGEMENT TO WORK. IT WAS A REAL SUCCESS STORY.\r\n\r\nIT HAS DONE NOTHING, BUT INCREASE OVER THE YEARS, AND IT'S THE BRIGHT HOPE FOR OUR FUTURE. YOU CANNOT ON DOCARE TO BE EVERYWHERE AND CAN'T COUNT ON OUR STREAM BIOLOGISTS TO SEE EVERYTHING. WE NEED THE EYES AND EARS ON THE GROUND OF OUR COMMUNITY AND THOSE WITH THE TRADITIONAL KNOWLEDGE THAT HAS BEEN PASSED FOR GENERATIONS THROUGH FAMILIES, AND WHO SINCERELY NOT JUST WANT TO KEEP FOR THEMSELVES AND HOARD, BUT TO SEE OUR FISHERIES PROSPER THROUGH APPLYING SOUND MANAGEMENT. SO ANYTHING YOU FOLKS CAN DO TO BRING THIS VERY, VERY IMPORTANT COMMUNITY-BASED EFFORT FORWARD. IT'S A LOT OF PAPERWORK, AND CROSSING TS AND DOTTING IS TO GET THESE MANAGEMENT AREAS PERMITTED. THERE'S A HANDFUL THAT HAVE GOTTEN PERMITTED ALREADY. BUT IT'S A VERY IMPORTANT STEP FOR OUR FISHERIES, AND I JUST PERSONALLY APPLAUD ALL THOSE IN KIPAHULU, WHO HAVE WORKED TOWARDS IN GOAL.\r\n\r\nTHEY ARE PART OF A NETWORK, AND THERE ARE OTHER AREAS WORKING TOWARDS A SIMILAR GOAL. WE HOPE TO SEE SOMETHING LIKE THIS IN SOME DAY. SO I WILL LEAVE IT THAT ON ITEM 22-205 AND SWITCH TO MY SECOND ITEM, WHICH IS 22-206. WELL, THIS IS THE SAGA OF THESE 257 ACRES OF LAND, THE POHAKEA WATERSHED ON THE SLOPES MA'ALAEA MAUKA AND THE REASON THE 257 ACRES THAT HAVE BEEN PROPOSED THROUGH NUMEROUS DEVELOPMENTS HAVE BEEN TURNED DOWN FOR DEVELOPMENT BY PLANNING DIRECTOR MISCHKE, PLANNING DIRECTOR BLAIN, PLANNING DIRECTOR FOLEY, PLANNING DIRECTOR HUNT, AND PLANNING DIRECTOR SPENCE. IT'S A BAD PLACE FOR DEVELOPMENT AND GOOD PLACE FOR CONSERVATION IN A NUTSHELL. UNFORTUNATELY IN THE MIDST OF A COMMUNITY AND COUNCIL AND MAYOR-SUPPORTED EFFORT TO ACQUIRE THESE LANDS, THE OWNERSHIP SWITCHED. NO BLAMES. IT JUST DID.\r\n\r\nIT HAS BECOME PERFECTLY CLEAR WITH AN EMAIL I RECEIVED THIS MORNING AS DID OTHERS, I THINK COUNCIL MEMBER KING WAS ON THAT THREAD FROM THE TRUST FOR PUBLIC LANDS, WHO HAS BEEN DILIGENTLY TRYING TO NEGOTIATE WITH THE NEW OWNERS, THAT THEY SIMPLY ARE NOT INTERESTED IN SEEING THE WHOLE PARCEL DEDICATED TO CONSERVATION. OUR ONE CHOICE LEFT IS TO USE A STRATEGY THAT IS PERFECTLY LEGAL, BUT RARELY USED BECAUSE IT SHOULD BE RESERVED FOR THE SITUATIONS WHERE IT'S REALLY

NEEDED, AND THIS IS ONE OF THEM. SO ON BEHALF OF THE SIERRA CLUB MAUI, ADVOCATING FOR THE PRESERVATION OF 257 ACRES OUR TRAILHEAD FOR THE LAHAINA POLI TRAIL AND DEEP ALLUVIAL SOILS. WE ASK YOU TO PASS THIS RESOLUTION AND SEND A MESSAGE TO THE MAYOR THAT THE COUNCIL SUPPORTS EMINENT DOMAIN PROCEEDINGS AND THE ACQUISITION BY THE PUBLIC OF THESE LANDS, AND THE WELLS, THAT GO WITH THEM. THANK YOU FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION. >> MEMBERS, QUESTIONS? IF NOT, MAY WE HAVE OUR NEXT TESTIFIER.\r\n\r\n[ READING SPEAKERS' NAMES ] >> ALOHA MAI KAKOU. MY NAME IS KAMALI'I AND FROM EAST MAUI. I'M HERE TODAY TO TESTIFY IN SUPPORT OF THE RESOLUTION 22-205 SUPPORTING A COMMUNITY-BASED SUBSISTENCE FISHING AREA IN KIPAHULU MOKU. AS A WIFE AND MOTHER KEIKI TEACHING FISHING AND GATHERING ON A DAILY BASIS, I STRONGLY URGE THE DESIGNATION OF THE KIPAHULU MOKU AS CBSFA, SO THAT THE PEOPLE OF KIPAHULU CAN FINALLY ESTABLISH ITS PROPOSED RULES AND MANAGE OUR RESOURCES WITH THE STATE OF HAWAI'I SUPPORT TO ENSURE PONO FISHING AND GATHERING FOR ALL OF LIVING WITHIN AND OUTSIDE OF THE MOKU OF THE KANAKA MAOLI CULTURAL PRACTITIONER WHO CARES PASSIONATELY FOR OUR -- ANYONE IN THE AUDIENCE WISHING TO TESTIFY GIVING US LIFE AND SUBSISTENCE BY OUR TRADITIONAL AND CUSTOMARY PRACTICES FOR US AND ALL GENERATIONS TO COME. AND DESIGNATING KIPAHULU MOKU AS CBSFA, I BELIEVE WE CAN MAKE THIS HAPPEN. A COMMUNITY OUTREACH AND SCIENCE HAS BEEN DONE OVER THE YEARS TO SUPPORT THE TIME IS NOW TO ESTABLISH THIS DESIGNATION AND MAKE IT KIPAHULU ABUNDANT AGAIN. MAHALO FOR YOUR TIME.\r\n\r\n>> MEMBERS, QUESTIONS? NO QUESTIONS. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. MAY WE HAVE THE NEXT TESTIFIER. >> OUR NEXT TESTIFIER IS KAMALANI. >> ALOHA MAI KAKOU. COUNCIL MEMBERS.\r\n\r\nI WOULD LIKE TO SUPPORT THE TESTIFIERS BEFORE ME, AND MY NAME IS MARY ANNE, ALSO KNOWN AS KAMALANI. DIVING RIGHT INTO IT, SUPPORTING RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT THE CBSFA IN KIPAHULU MOKU. I HAVE TO MENTION KIPAHULU MOKU IS ONE OF THE SMALLEST MOKUS ON MAUI. I THINK [ INAUDIBLE ] DEPARTMENT OF INTERIOR NATIONAL PARK IN THEIR BACKYARD AND KIPAHULU MOKU CAN SEE UP TO 22,500 VISITORS A DAY. WHEN WE TALK ABOUT THE OUTREACH, KIPAHULU MOKU HAS DONE, IT HAS BEEN EXTENSIVE. I HAVE BEEN LISTENING AND INVOLVED, AND THE AMOUNT OF PUBLIC MEETINGS, AND PRESS THAT HAS BEEN OUT THERE REGARDING THESE CONSERVATION EFFORTS HAVE BEEN GOING ON FOR MOST LIKELY A DECADE. IN THE PAST YEAR, THIS SPECIFIC INITIATIVE, THE CBSFA IN KIPAHULU MOKU WAS ON THE FRONT PAGE OF MAUI NEWS TWICE, AND LIKE I SAID, THERE'S BEEN EXTENSIVE MEETINGS INVOLVING FISHERMEN THROUGHOUT THE ISLAND.\r\n\r\nTHIS OPENS THE DOOR TO MORE COMMUNITY-BASED MANAGEMENT AREAS. I CAN'T TELL YOU HOW MANY CAMPERS ARE SET UP GETTING READY FOR THE WEEKEND, AS MENTIONED. THE SEASON IS OPEN AND LOBSTER. SO WE CAN ONLY IMAGINE WHAT WHAT WILL BE COMING OUT OF EVERYBODY'S NETS THIS WEEK THIS NEEDS TO BE NORMALIZED, THESE CONSERVATION EFFORTS. FOLLOWING CBSFA KIPAHULU MOKU AND TO PRETTY MUCH REPLICATE BAG LIMITS. IT VARIES WHEN IT COMES TO SPECIES, BUT WE'RE STILL EAST MAUI AND IT'S SIMILAR. WHEN WE TALK ABOUT BAG LIMITS LIKE MENTIONED BY MS.\r\n\r\nKEANI, KIPAHULU CBSFA IS LIMITED 40 PER PERSON A DAY AND OF COURSE, IF YOU HAVE FIVE GUYS IS 200 A DAY. THESE NUMBERS ARE VERY REALISTIC AND WE ALL KNOW WHAT LUAUS LOOK LIKE, AND IT'S REALLY DISHEARTENING TO SEE OPIHI IN THE TRASHCANS. PEOPLE SHOULD LEARN TO SELF-REGULATE. YOU DON'T HAVE TO GATHER IT, EAT IT OR GRAB IT, BECAUSE THE CULTURAL THING TO DO -- THE CULTURAL THING TO DO IS TO PROTECT OUR BACKYARDS. LIKE I SAID, THIS OPENS THE DOOR SUPPORTING THIS RESOLUTION OPENS THE DOOR FOR MANY COMMUNITIES. WE ALL KNOW DOCARE DOESN'T HAVE THE CAPACITY TO REGULATE. SO PUTTING THIS IN OUR COMMUNITY'S HANDS WILL ONLY EMPOWER EVERYONE.\r\n\r\nIT'S A LEARNING LESSON, LIKE MOLOKA'I, LIKE

LANA'I, WHEN IT COMES TO THE COMMERCIALIZING OF FISH, THAT IS ALWAYS A HOT-TOPIC. KIPAHULU MOKU IS ONLY ASKING THAT YOU DO NOT TAKE COMMERCIAL -- DO NOT TAKE AKULI FOR COMMERCIAL PURPOSES. I HAVE BEEN THERE FOR HUKILAU TRADITIONAL GATHERING IN KIPAHULU MOKU, IN HANA AND IT'S A WONDERFUL PRACTICE THAT MUST BE CARRIED ON. SO I HOPE YOU GET TO DO SOME HOMEWORK ON CBSFAS BECAUSE IT'S VERY PUBLIC. IT'S A GREAT -- YOU KNOW THIS NONPROFIT KIPAHULU 'OHANA HAS BEEN GETTING COMMEMORATED AND HONORED FOR CONSERVATION EFFORTS AND A LOT OF OTHER NONPROFITS ARE PICKING UP SIMILARITIES -- I WOULD JUST LIKE TO -- (BELL RINGING) I ALSO SUPPORT RESOLUTION 22-206, EMINENT DOMAIN OF MA'ALAEA. SO PLEASE READ THE RESOLUTION IN ITS ENTIRETY AND CHECK OUT THE VERY BEAUTIFUL WEBSITE KIPAHULU MOKU. KIPAHULU.ORG/CBSFA.\r\n\r\nMAHALO TO THEM FOR ALL THEIR EFFORTS AND MAHALO TO YOU GUYS FOR LISTENING. CONTINUE TO ASK QUESTIONS AND HAPPY ALOHA FRIDAY. >> AND TO YOU AS WELL. MEMBERS, QUESTIONS? IF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH. MAY WE HAVE THE NEXT TESTIFIER, PLEASE. >> OUR NEXT TESTIFIER IS JEROME KIKI . JEROME -- NOBODY IS CURRENTLY SIGNED UP FOLLOWING MR.\r\n\r\nKIKI VI LAST CALL. >> THIS IS LAST CALL FOR TESTIMONY OF RESOLUTIONS IN THE CATEGORY K OF THE AGENDA. LAST AND FINAL CALL. >> ANY OBJECTIONS, MEMBERS TO CLOSING PUBLIC TESTIMONY AND ACCEPTING WRITTEN -- DO WE HAVE ONE? OKAY. WE HAVE ONE. >> MR.\r\n\r\nPEREZ. ALBERT PEREZ. >> YES. NICE TO SEE YOU ALL AGAIN. ALBERT PEREZ, MAUI TOMORROW. TESTIFYING ON RESOLUTION 22-205, THE KIPAHULU CBSFA. WE SUPPORT THIS.\r\n\r\nYOU KNOW, COMMUNITY-BASED SUBSISTENCE FISHING AREAS ARE A WAY TO MAKE SURE THAT THE FISHERY RESOURCES ARE PROTECTED AND CAN CONTINUE TO EXIST. AND IT'S BASED ON THE KNOWLEDGE OF AND WITH THE PARTICIPATION OF THE PEOPLE WHO KNOW THE AREA BEST. SO I WILL LEAVE IT AT THAT. EXCITED TO SEE THIS. WE SUPPORT THIS RESOLUTION. ALSO WANTED TO TESTIFY ON 22-206. MA'ALAEA EMINENT DOMAIN AND URGING COUNCIL TO SUPPORT THIS RESOLUTION. IT'S WELL-SUITED FOR PRESERVATION AS OPEN SPACE.\r\n\r\nMAUI COUNTY IDENTIFIED THIS AREA IN THE 2006 SCENIC AND HISTORIC RESOURCES INVENTORY, AND THIS PARCEL WAS GIVEN HIGH VALUE AS A SCENIC RESOURCE. ALSO THERE'S MUCH DESTRUCTION THAT HAS BEEN CAUSED BY LARGE STORM FLOWS PASSING THROUGH THESE LANDS, ESPECIALLY AFTER FIRES ELIMINATE THE PROTECTION AND EXPOSE THE LAND TO EROSION. MAJOR BROWN WATER EVENTS, MA'ALAEA BAY HUMPBACK SANCTUARY. GOVERNMENT AGENCIES, COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS, COUNTY COUNCIL AND THE MAYOR HAVE ALL BEEN WORKING ON PLANS TO ADDRESS THIS, AND WE NEED TO SEE IT THROUGH FOR THE GOOD OF OUR COMMUNITY, AND THE ENVIRONMENT. THESE TYPES OF LONG-TERM PROJECTS ARE DIFFICULT TO PLAN WHEN THERE'S A CHANCE THAT A LARGE AREA OF LAND WILL BE BROKEN INTO PRIVATELY-OWNED PARCELS, ESPECIALLY WHEN PEOPLE WHO HAVE BEEN INVOLVED PULL OUT AT THE LAST-MINUTE. SO PROTECTING THIS LAND WILL BE FAR SIMPLER AND MORE LIKELY TO BE SUCCESSFUL, IF IT'S UNDER PUBLIC OWNERSHIP. SO WE URGE YOU TO SUPPORT THIS RESOLUTION.\r\n\r\nMAHALO. >> THANK YOU, ANY QUESTIONS FOR THE TESTIFIER? IF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH. ANY OTHER TESTIFIERS? >> WE HAVE ONE MORE TESTIFIER. UALANI NAIPO. >> ALOHA KAKOU, MAHALO NUI FOR PROVIDING TESTIMONY.\r\nI'M A LINEAL DESCENDANT FROM SOUTH KONA ON MOKU KIAWE. WE SUPPORT OUR CBSFA DESIGNATION AND RULES PACKAGE PROMULGATED EARLIER THIS MONTH. AND WE LOOK AT KIPAHULU AS OUR SISTER COMMUNITY. WE HAVE BEEN STRIVING FOR PRETTY MUCH PARTNER HAND IN HAND OVER THE LAST COUPLE OF YEARS, BUT BOTH OF OUR EFFORTS, COMMUNITY, LIKE EFFORTS STARTED BY GENERATIONS BEFORE US, AND THE SAME STORY IS PROMINENT THROUGHOUT THE PAI'AINA. WHEN DNLR WAS GIVEN AUTHORIZATION TO PUT IN PLACE COMMUNITY-BASED SUBSISTENCE FISHING AREAS, WE ONLY HAD ONE BEFORE WE MILOLI'I

DESIGNATED AS CBSFA. KIPAHULU HAS BEEN WORKING VERY HARD AT IT AND WITH THE -- I IMAGINE WITH THE NUMBER OF ISSUES THAT WE'RE FACING ON THE ISLANDS THAT MAYBE PERHAPS THAT MAY NOT HAVE BEEN ON YOUR RADAR? BUT I CAN TELL YOU VERY MUCH IT'S ON THOSE OF US COMMUNITIES THAT STRIVE TO NOT ONLY PUT PROTECTION ON MARINE RESOURCES, BUT TO PUT PROTECTION ON TRADITIONAL AND CUSTOMARY PRACTICES TO PUT IN PLACE A COMMUNITY-BASED SUBSISTENCE FISHING AREA.\r\n\r\nSO I IMPLORE YOU TO HAVE THE INFORMATION THAT YOU ARE CONFIDENT IN THE RIGHT DECISION TO SUPPORT YOUR COMMUNITIES ON MAUI. JUST ONE ISLAND AWAY, WE SENT OUR ALOHA TO KIPAHULU AND WISH TO SUPPORT YOU IN ANY WAY WE CAN. ALOHA AND MAHALO. >> THANK YOU. MEMBERS, QUESTIONS? IF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH. >> CHAIR?\r\n\r\n>> I'M SORRY. MEMBER MOLINA. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. ALOHA, MS. NAIPO, THANKS FOR BEING HERE AND REPRESENTING THE COMMUNITY. FOR OUR INFORMATION, DID YOU SEEK OUT SUPPORT FROM YOUR BIG ISLAND COUNCIL ON OUR REQUEST, AS WELL AS THE MAYOR OF THE BIG ISLAND? >> YES.\r\n\r\nACTUALLY, MAILE DAVID WAS REALLY A STRONG COUNCIL MEMBER THAT SUPPORTED US. WE DID OUTREACH, AND SUPPORT TO DIFFERENT HAWAIIAN ORGANIZATIONS. SO CIVIC CLUB MEMBERS, ROYAL ORDER OF KAMEHAMEHA. WE WENT AFTER DOFAW, BECAUSE WE HAVE NATURAL RESOURCES SURROUNDING OUR AREAS AND DIFFERENT CONSERVATION GROUPS THROUGHOUT. WE ALSO DID APPROACH DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOMELANDS HOMESTEAD ASSOCIATION. SO WE DID QUITE A BIT OF REACH OUT, AS WELL AS WHEN WE GO THROUGH SCOPING, WE ARE REQUIRED TO GO TO STATEWIDE SCOPING. SO THE INPUT WAS ANNOUNCED SO WE COULD SOLICIT FEEDBACK FROM THROUGHOUT THE PAI'AINA.\r\n\r\n>> MAHALO. THANK YOU, MADAM CHAIR. >> THANK YOU. MEMBERS, ANY MORE QUESTIONS? IF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH. >> CHAIR, WE'LL TRY ONE MORE TIME TO MR. JEROME LAST CALL FOR TESTIMONY ON RESOLUTIONS.\r\n\r\n>> IS JUNIOR SIGNED UP FOR THIS? >> YES. I CAN TALK. >> YES, YOU CAN. >> HELLO. >> YOU'RE TALKING ON RESOLUTIONS? >> YES, SIR.\r\n\r\n>> OKAY. >> GOING TO TALK ABOUT THE RESOLUTIONS FOR KIPAHULU AND THE WATERSHED ONE. KA'ANAPALI WITH THE MAYOR, THE MAYOR IS TRYING TO KICK THE BALL -- THE KIPAHULU ONE, SUPPORT THOSE BUGGERS. YOU KNOW, THEY ARE WORKING HARD. YOU KNOW, THAT'S WHAT MAUI AND HAWAI'I WE GET AWAY FROM, FROM EACH COMMUNITY TAKING CARE OF THEIR RESOURCES. YOU KNOW, MY 'OHANA HERE IN KANA, MY UNCLE USED TO CONTROL THE KANA BAY AND THE BUGGER WAS ALWAYS FULL WITH LIMU. THAT BUGGER WAS GOLD OVER THERE.\r\n\r\nHE USED TO SIT IN THE BAY AND MAKE SURE HE CHECKED EVERYBODY'S BAG AND MAKE SURE ALL THE BUGGERS DON'T TAKE TOO MUCH, ONLY ONE BAG PER PERSON. HEY, DON'T TAKE TOO MUCH, WE GET LEAKAGE. SO SUPPORT THE KIPAHULU 'OHANA OUT THERE, THE WHOLE EAST MAUI. YOU GOT TO SUPPORT THEM GUYS. MAUI, YOU GUYS BAD AS, BECAUSE MAYBE WE'LL SHOW EXAMPLE TO THE REST OF THE STATE ON HOW HAWAIIANS CAN CONTROL AND CONSERVE BECAUSE DLNR DOESN'T HAVE ENOUGH WORKERS. MAYBE THE COMMUNITY GUYS TAKE CARE OF THEM, THEN OUR ISLANDS AND OUR RESOURCES WILL BE FINE. SO I SUPPORT THE KIPAHULU ONE.\r\n\r\nAND NOW GOING BACK TO THE WATERSHED ONE. YOU KNOW HOW I FEEL ABOUT CROOKED DEVELOPERS? AND LOSING CONTROL OF OUR ISLAND, OVERDEVELOPED, AND GREEDY AND ALL OF THAT KIND OF STUFF. YESTERDAY, YOU GUYS HAD THE ONE WITH THE PROJECT THAT IS AGAIN BAD ASS. I SUPPORT. SO AGAIN, PLUS YOU ARE TRYING TO DO THE EMINENT DOMAIN FOR THE STUPID GREG BROWN, THE OTHER STUPID DEVELOPER FOR PURCHASE JUST ONE HOUSE, YOU KNOW WHAT I MEAN? THE ONE TO DO EMINENT DOMAIN FOR THE WHOLE CULTURAL PLACE, THE WHOLE ACRES TO STOP THEM FROM BEING OVERDEVELOPED BY THAT CROOKED DEVELOPER PETER MARTIN.\r\n\r\nSO THIS IS THE BUGGER, THE ONE THAT YOU HAVE TO DO. STATE HOW, BOY, RUFFLE SOME FEATHERS. GET TOGETHER AND CHANGE THE REST OF HAWAI'I HOW TO CONTROL OUR RESOURCES ON OUR ISLAND. YES, SIR, STOP THE

OVERDEVELOPMENT. LIKE I SAID, WALKING KA'ANAPALI IN THE CONCRETE JUNGLE. ALL THE GRASS IS NICE AND GREEN, BUT YOU GO TO MY HOUSE, THE BUGGER IS DRY, WITH BRUSH FIRES. OKAY, YOU GUYS HAVE A GREAT ONE.\r\n\r\n>> THANK YOU, JUNIOR. ANY QUESTIONS FOR THE TESTIFIER? IF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH. BYE. BEHAVE. >> YES, SIR. >> CHAIR, THERE ARE NO OTHER INDIVIDUALS CURRENTLY SIGNED UP TO TESTIFY.\r\n\r\nTHIS IS LAST CALL, LAST AND FINAL CALL TO TESTIFY ON AGENDA CATEGORY K, RESOLUTIONS. >> MEMBERS, I NEED A FIVE-MINUTE RECESS, PLEASE. NEXT. >> AND RESOLUTION 22-205 ENTITLED, "SUPPORTING THE COMMUNITY-BASED SUBSISTENCE FISHING AREA DESIGNATION FOR KIPAHULU MOKU." >> MEMBER SINENCI.\r\n\>> THANK YOU, CHAIR. I MOVE TO ADOPT RESOLUTION 22-205. >> SECOND. >> IT'S BEEN MOVED BY MEMBER SINENCI AND SECOND BY VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ TO ADOPT RESOLUTION 22-205. DISCUSSION, MEMBER SINENCI. >> MAHALO, CHAIR. IF THE MEMBERS WILL INDULGE ME, I WOULD LIKE TO READ THE RESOLUTION INTO THE RECORD. RECOGNIZING YEARS' OF HARD WORK BY OUR RESIDENTS AND I WILL READ FAST: WHEREAS, IN 1994 THE HAWAI'I STATE LEGISLATURE ENACTED SECTION 188-22.6 HAWAI'I REVISED STATUTES GIVING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES THE AUTHORITY TO DESIGNATE COMMUNITY-BASED SUBSISTENCE FISHING AREAS FOR THE PURPOSE OF REAFFIRMING AND PROTECTING FISHING PRACTICES CURRENTLY AND TRADITIONALLY EXERCISED FOR PURPOSE OF NATIVE HAWAIIAN SUBSISTENCE, CULTURE, AND RELIGION, WHEREAS, THE DLNR CAN ESTABLISH MANAGEMENT STRATEGIES FOR CBSFAS BY ADOPTING RULES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE FOR STATE AGENCIES OUTLINED IN CHAPTER 91, H.R.S., AND COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS CAN PROPOSE CBSFAS TO THE DLNR FOR CONSIDERATION BY SUBMITTING A MANAGEMENT PLAN THAT INCLUDES REGULATORY RECOMMENDATIONS AND WHEREAS, AS A RESULT OF INTERNATIONAL ADVOCACY BY INDIGENOUS PEOPLE AND LOCAL COMMUNITIES IN SOME CASES LED BY GRASSROOTS NATIVE HAWAIIAN COMMUNITIES, GLOBAL ENVIRONMENTAL INSTITUTIONS HAVE RECOGNIZED THE SIGNIFICANCE AND IMPORTANCE OF INDIGENOUS TRIBAL NATION OR COMMUNITY-BASED NATURAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT; AND WHEREAS, DEVELOPMENTS IN SCIENCE AND SOCIAL SCIENCE RESEARCH HAVE DOCUMENTED THE ROLE OF TRADITIONAL ECOLOGICAL KNOWLEDGE AND ITS EFFICACY IN AN AGE OF CLIMATE CHANGE AND MASSIVE NATURAL RESOURCE CONCERNS; AND WHEREAS, LESS THAN 200 YEARS AGO, THE HAWAIIAN ISLANDS SUSTAINED A THRIVING AND SUBSTANTIAL NATIVE HAWAIIAN POPULATION, THROUGH RESOURCE GOVERNANCE SYSTEM FOUNDED ON OBSERVATIONAL, PLACE-BASED, AND EXPERIENTIAL KNOWLEDGE, TRIED AND TRUE CENTURIES- LONG PRACTICES; AND WHEREAS, NATIVE HAWAIIAN TRADITIONAL AND CUSTOMARY PRACTICES FOR SUSTAINING FISHERIES WERE ADAPTIVE AND BASED ON TIME-TESTED INTIMATE KNOWLEDGE OF AHUPUA'A RESOURCES AND INCLUDED KAPU, LAHUI ON CERTAIN FLORA AND FAUNA SPECIES, TEMPORARY FISHERY CLOSURES AND HARVEST

LIMITS BASED ON SPECIALS, SIZE, SEX CHARACTERISTICS, NATURAL CELESTIAL CYCLES AND SPAWNING TIMES; AND WHEREAS, NEARSHORE FISHERIES IN MAUI COUNTY AND THE STATE PLAY A KEY ROLE IN HOUSEHOLD SUBSISTENCE THE STATEWIDE SOCIO-ECONOMIC FABRIC AND QUEST FOR FOOD SECURITY; AND WHEREAS, BEYOND PROVIDING FOOD, SUBSISTENCE FISHING CONTRIBUTES TO LARGELY UNQUANTIFIABLE YET EXTREMELY VALUABLE BENEFITS INCLUDING SERVING THE CULTURAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL ECOSYSTEM UPHOLDING LONG-HELD COMMUNITY PRACTICES VALUES AND VIRTUES, SUCH AS GENEROSITY, INDUSTRIOUSNESS, AND SELF-RELIANCE, DEVELOPING HEALTHY ROLES, SKILLS AND NETWORKS, BUILDING COMMUNAL RECIPROCITY AND ADVANCING COMMUNITY AND SOCIETAL INSURANCE, ESPECIALLY FOR RURAL COMMUNITIES THAT SERVE AS KIPUKA OR OASES OF OUR MOST CHERISHED CULTURAL LEGACIES; AND WHEREAS, NEARSHORE OCEAN RESOURCING AND IS IT SYSTEMS HAVE BEEN COMPRISE OR COMPROMISED BY OVERFISHING, ABUSE OF FISHING TECHNOLOGIES, INSUFFICIENT ENFORCEMENT CAPACITY OF LEGAL INFRASTRUCTURE, COASTAL DEVELOPMENT, LOCAL AND GLOBAL POLLUTION, CONFLICTING OCEAN USES AND PURPOSES INVASIVE SPECIES, CONTINENT-FOCUSED AND OVERCENTRALIZED RESOURCE MANAGEMENT PARADIGMS AND CLIMATE CHANGE; AND WHEREAS, REGULATORY AGENCIES ARE OFTEN UNDERFUNDED AND UNDER-RESOURCED EVEN AS RAPID HUMAN POPULATIONS EXPANSION AND EXPLOITATION OF OCEAN RESOURCES ARE AT THEIR PEAK; AND WHEREAS, TOP-DOWN CENTRALIZED DECISION-MAKING PROCESSES ARE OFTEN INEFFECTIVE IN MANAGING COMPLEX AND UNIQUE PLACE-BASED ECOSYSTEMS THAT WOULD GREATLY BENEFIT FROM LOCAL AND INDIGENOUS KNOWLEDGE AND TRADITIONAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT; AND WHEREAS, OUR LOCAL COMMUNITIES ARE CONCERNED ABOUT THESE IMPORTANT ISSUES AND MANY KNOWLEDGEABLE INDIVIDUALS ARE EAGER TO COLLABORATE WITH APPROPRIATE GOVERNMENT AGENCIES IN THE EFFORT TO MALAMA OUR NATURAL RESOURCES; AND WHEREAS, IT IS ESSENTIAL TO OUR CULTURAL IDENTITY, SENSE OF PLACE, AND SUSTAINABILITY AS KA PAE'AINA 'O HAWAI'I THAT OUR COLLECTIVE VALUES, AND INTERGENERATIONAL TRADITIONS PASSED DOWN BUT OUR KUPUNA ARE RENEWED, PRACTICED AND PERPETUATED; AND WHEREAS, SINCE THE 1990S COMMUNITIES LIKE KIPAHULU ON MAUI, MO'OMOMI ON MOLOKA'I, MILOLI'I HO'OKENA, KALAPANA ON HAWAI'I ISLAND, HA'ENA AND HANALEI ON KAUA'I AND EWA AND WAI'ANAE AND OTHERS HAVE GATHERED TO HELP ESTABLISH A MOVEMENT FOR NEARSHORE COMMUNITY FISHERY GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT AND THIS MOVEMENT INSPIRED BY THE VISION FOR FOCUSED AND ORGANIZATIONS SUCH AS KAI KULEANA, MAUI NUI MAKAI NETWORK, E ALU PU, LIMU HUI AND KUA'AINA ULU 'AUAMO; AND WHEREAS, THE TWO-YEAR PILOT PROJECT MANAGE BY HAWAIIAN HOMESTEADERS AND INTEGRATING INDIGENOUS ECOLOGICAL KNOWLEDGE AND COMPLEX SCIENTIFIC APPROACHES TO MANAGEMENT OF MO'OMOMI AND KAWA'ALOA BAYS ON MOLOKA'I INSPIRED EIGHT COMMUNITIES TO ESTABLISH THEIR OWN TRADITIONAL MANAGEMENT STRUCTURE, AND RULES CUSTOMIZED TO THEIR UNIQUE PLACE UNDER THE CBSFA PROCESS FOR WHICH NECESSITY CONTINUE TO AWAIT STATE APPROVAL; AND WHEREAS, IN 2005 MILOLI'I ON HAWAI'I ISLAND, BECAME THE FIRST PERMANENTLY DESIGNATED CBSFA IN THE STATE, FOLLOW BY HA'ENA ON KAUA'I, IN 2006, MANY OTHER COMMUNITIES CONTINUE TO ACTIVELY PURSUE CBSFA DESIGNATION; AND WHEREAS, THE HA'ENA CBSFA RULES AND MANAGEMENT PLAN WERE APPROVED IN 2015, AND HUI MAKA'AINANA O MAKANA HAS ACTIVELY MANAGED THEIR AREA IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE STATE, RESULTING IN INCREASE IN FISH POPULATIONS WITH ONGOING MONITORING ENFORCEMENT AND EDUCATION AND OUTREACH EFFORTS AND WHEREAS, ON SEPTEMBER 1, 2016 THE INTERNATIONAL UNION FOR CONSERVATION OF NATURE'S WORLD CONSERVATION CONGRESS IN HAWAI'I AND AS PART OF THE SUSTAINABLE HAWAI'I INITIATIVE GOVERNOR IGE ANNOUNCED THE STATE'S COMMITMENT TO EFFECTIVELY MANAGE THE 30% OF HAWAI'I NEARSHORE WATER BY 2030; AND WHEREAS, THE MARINE 30X30 INITIATIVE FOCUSES ON DEVELOPING AND

STRENGTHENING OTHER COMPONENTS OF EFFECTIVE MANAGEMENT, INCLUDING PARTNERSHIP WITH COMMUNITIES TO INTEGRATE PLACE-BASED KNOWLEDGE PONO PRACTICES AND THE BEST OF CURRENT SCIENCE AND SOCIOCULTURAL UNDERSTANDING; AND WHEREAS, KIPAHULA 'OHANA, INC. IS A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION, FOUNDED IN 1995 AND DEDICATED TO THE CULTURAL SUSTAINABILITIES OF THE KIPAHULU MOKU IN EAST MAUI; AND WHEREAS, KIPAHULU 'OHANA, INC.\r\nENVISIONS FAMILY WORKING IN HARMONY TO PRESERVE AND ENHANCE THE TRADITIONAL CULTURAL PRACTICES OF HAWAIIAN PEOPLE THROUGH CULTURALLY-BASED AGRICULTURAL AND RESOURCE MANAGEMENT PROJECTS FROM MAUKA TO MAKAI; AND WHEREAS, KIPAHULU 'OHANA, INC. MANAGES KAPAHU LIVING FARM A TRADITIONAL WETLAND TARO FARM THROUGH COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT WITH THE HALE'AKALA NATIONAL PARK, FOR KIPAHULU KITCHEN, A CERTIFIED COMMERCIAL KITCHEN, AGRICULTURAL PROCESSING PLANT, HAS ESTABLISHED A VOLUNTARY OPIHI REST AREA NO-TAKE ZONE ADJACENT TO HALE'AKALA NATIONAL PARK WITH EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH AND REGULAR BIOLOGICAL MONITORING, AND CONDUCTS ONGOING FISHING AND HUMAN USE SURVEYS; AND WHEREAS, IN 2012 KIPAHULU 'OHANA PUBLISHED THEIR KIPAHULU MALAMA I KE KAI COMMUNITY ACTION PLANNED OVER TWO YEARS WITH INPUT FROM MORE THAN 50 COMMUNITY MEMBERS, FISHERMEN, SCIENTISTS, MANAGERS AND TEACHERS WHICH IDENTIFIED THE UNSUSTAINABILITY HARVEST OF FISH, LIMU, AND OPIHI AS CONTRIBUTING TO THE DEGRADATION OF THE MARINE DEVELOPMENT AND A THREAT TO THE TRADITIONAL SUBSISTENCE LIFESTYLE OF THE AREA; AND WHEREAS, ONE MALAMA I KE KAI PLAN WITH STRATEGY OBTAIN CBSFA DESIGNATION AND FORMALLY RECOGNIZE LOCAL COMMUNITIES AS VALUED CO-MANAGEMENT PARTNERS FOR PROTECTING RESOURCES AND REAFFIRM AND PROTECT TRADITIONAL AND CUSTOMARY PRACTICES FOR SUBSISTENCE AND CULTURE; AND WHEREAS, KIPAHULU 'OHANA, INC. HAS CONDUCTED DOZENS OF COMMUNITY OUTREACH MEETINGS OVER THE LAST TEN YEARS TO GATHER INPUT ON THE PROPOSED RULES AND MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR KIPAHULU MOKU, WHICH WAS SUBMITTED TO THE DNLR IN OCTOBER 2019; AND WHEREAS, THE DNLR PLANS TO BEGIN THE FORMAL CBSFA RULE-MAKING PROCESS UNDER CHAPTER 91 H.R.S. FOR THE PROPOSED KIPAHULU MOKU COMMUNITY-BASED SUBSISTENCE FISHING AREA IN 2022; AND, NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI THAT 1, IT SUPPORTS THE DESIGNATION OF KIPAHULU MOKU AS COMMUNITY-BASED SUBSISTENCE FISHING AREA AND CREATION OF RULES AND MAJORITY PLAN FOR KIPAHULU MOKU CBSFA AND 2, THAT IT SUPPORTS THE KIPAHULU COMMUNITY'S CONTINUED EFFORTS TO INTEGRATE PLACE-BASED AND NATIVE HAWAIIAN TRADITIONAL AND CUSTOMARY PRACTICES AND VALUES WITH BEST PRACTICES AND CONTEMPORARY SCIENTIFIC METHODS FOR THE BENEFIT OF PRESENT AND FUTURE GENERATIONS. AND MEMBERS, I WON'T READ THE CERTIFICATE COPIES LIST. >> THANK YOU. >> MEMBERS, DO YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS FOR THE RESOURCE FOLKS? MR.\r\n\r\nCRAWFORD AND MR. LYNN? NO? MEMBER MOLINA? >> THANK YOU, MADAM CHAIR. QUESTION FOR MY COLLEAGUE FROM EAST MAUI, MR. SINENCI.\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU, MR. SINENCI FOR BRINGING THIS MATTER TO OUR ATTENTION. JUST A COUPLE OF QUICK QUESTIONS. THE DLNR PLAYS A BIG ROLE IN THIS AND YOU ARE ASKING US TO ACT ON THE FLOOR. WAS THE DLNR INVITED TO PARTICIPATE? OR TO BE HERE AS A RESOURCE IF SOME OF US HAVE QUESTIONS? BECAUSE THIS IS SOMETHING NEW FOR ME.\r\n\r\nI DON'T HAVE A FULL UNDERSTANDING OF IT, BUT WAS THE DLNR INVITED TO COME TO TODAY'S COUNCIL MEETING? >> THANK YOU, MEMBER MOLINA FOR THAT QUESTION. I BELIEVE DLNR WOULD BE THE NEXT STEP IN THE PROCESS. SO IT LOOKS LIKE THE KIPAHULU 'OHANA IS JUST COMING FOR OUR SUPPORT AS A COUNTY COUNCIL. SO THAT WHEN THEY DO GO AHEAD AND TAKE THIS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES, THAT THEY, TOO, LIKE HAWAI'I ISLAND, HAS THE SUPPORT OF THE GREATER COMMUNITY. THE REASON I ASKED THIS, YOU ARE ASKING THE COUNCIL TO

TAKE A POSITION ON THIS AND SOME OF US WOULD LIKE A BETTER UNDERSTANDING OF THE WHOLE STRATEGY OF WHAT THE MANAGEMENT PLAN WOULD BE FOR OUR OWN KNOWLEDGE SO WE CAN MAKE A DECISION THAT IS FULLY INFORMED. IN MY OPINION, I THINK DLNR SHOULD HAVE BEEN INVITED, BUT I DO SUPPORT THE RESOLUTION IN ITSELF.\r\n\r\nI THINK JUST FOR MY OWN UNDERSTANDING, I WOULD HAVE LIKED TO HAVE THE DLNR HERE. SO WE CAN GET A BETTER UNDERSTANDING OF THE TIMETABLE, HOW LONG THIS WILL TAKE? AND WHEN THE DESIGNATION, AND OF THOSE OTHER FACTS THAT I THINK SOME OF US WOULD LIKE A BETTER UNDERSTANDING OF. SO ANYWAY, I COMMEND KIPAHULU 'OHANA, INC. AND EVERYONE ELSE IN THE COMMUNITY AND MS. NAIPO, WHO SHARED HER MANA'O AS WELL. THANK YOU.\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU, MADAM CHAIR. >> THANK YOU. DISCUSSION, MEMBER PALTIN. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR, AND I FEEL PERHAPS I SHOULD DISCLOSE I'M A MEMBER OF THE SAVE COALITION AND I HAVE BEEN FOLLOWING THE WORK OF CBSFAS FOR DECADES. FIRST BECOMING FAMILIAR WITH IT THROUGH UNCLE POI POI ON MOLOKA'I AND WEIGH-IN, THIS IS NOT SOMETHING NEW. THIS IS SOMETHING OLD. AND IT'S SOMETHING OLD THAT WE HAVE TO COME BACK TO, BECAUSE THE SOMETHING NEW THAT IS DNLR DOES NOT WORK.\r\n\r\nDLNR IN RESPONSE TO FINDING DECLINING FISH STOCKS IN THE '50S, IMPORTED THREE SPECIES TO HAWAI'I AND STUDIES SHOW THAT ROY EATS 2.5 TIMES ITS MASS BODY WEIGHT. ONE ROY WILL EAT 249 ENDEMIC FISH A YEAR. MOST TIMES YOU DON'T WANT TO EAT ROY, BECAUSE THEY GOT SIG TARA. SO NOT VERY MANY PEOPLE EAT ROY. I THINK THEY FEED IT TO THE OCEAN CENTER OR USE FOR FISH FERTILIZER. THESE THERE PLACES TRYING TO MAKE COMMERCIAL BUSINESS OUT OF CATCHING THOSE THREE SPECIES FOR TOURISTS TO PRACTICE SPEARFISHING. BUT IT'S A BIG PROBLEM.\r\n\r\nAND THAT IS WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOU COME, AND MEDDLE IN A SYSTEM WHERE YOU DON'T KNOW THE OUTCOMES. EVEN IF YOU LOOK AT DLNR'S RULES REGARDING SPAWNING OPENING MO'I ON A FULL MOON SIGNED OF CYCLE, AND PLENTY OF PEOPLE KNOW SEPTEMBER/OCTOBER, IF YOU HAVE A LINK OVER 14" IN A LOT OF PLACES ARE STILL SPAWNING. AND THAT IS WHY HANALEI, THEY MADE THEIR MOON CALENDAR AND TRAINED THEIR OPIO TO SEE IF WHEN YOU CATCH A FISH, IF THERE IS EGGS? BECAUSE THE DLNR RULES DON'T WORK IF THEY ARE TRYING TO CONSERVE SPECIES WHEN THEY HAVE SIZE LIMITS. IT'S SCIENTIFICALLY PROVEN THAT BIGGER FISH LAY MORE EGGS, MORE VIABLE EGGS. IF YOU CATCH ONE 27" OLU IS EQUIVALENT TO CATCHING 86/14" ULUA. SO WHY HAVE THAT KIND OF SIZE LIMIT?\r\nAND THEY SAY SLOT LIMITS HAVE TOO HARD. BUT I DID SEE, I THINK MR. KAKOU FROM DLNR IS ON. SO I YIELD TO HIS AUTHORITY, BECAUSE HE IS THE MAN. THANK YOU. >> MEMBERS, WE'LL BE TIMING YOU, TWO MINUTES. TWO MINUTES IN THE FIRST-ROUND.\r\n\r\nVICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ. >> MAHALO, CHAIR. THIS ISN'T TO APPLY TO MY TWO MINUTES, BUT MEMBER MOLINA ASKED ABOUT DLNR HAVING A REPRESENTATIVE? SO AS MEMBER PALTIN STATED, MR. KEKUA WAS HERE AND I DON'T KNOW IF HE WAS GIVEN A HEAD'S UP ABOUT SERVING AS RESOURCE PERSON, BUT HE IS THE PERSON IN DLNR AND IF MEMBER MOLINA HAD QUESTIONS, I THINK THAT WOULD BE THE TIME. AGAIN, THIS DOESN'T COUNT AS MY FIRST-ROUND, JUST LETTING YOU KNOW MORE INFORMATION ON WHAT. >> WE'RE GOING TO HAVE TO DESIGNATE THAT PERSON.\r\n\r\nIS IT MR. LUNA? >> YES, EVERYBODY CALLS ME LUNA KEKUA. ANY OBJECTIONS? >> NO OBJECTIONS. >> WE HAVE QUESTIONS FOR YOU FROM MEMBER MOLINA. >> THANK YOU, MADAM CHAIR.\r\n\r\nGIVEN TWO MINUTES TO HELP MOVE THINGS ALONG HERE. MY GENERAL QUESTION ABOUT THE PROCESS ITSELF. WE HAVE BEEN ASKED TO TAKE ACTION TODAY AS FAR AS THE DESIGNATION FOR DNLR TO START THE PROCESS. JUST IN GENERAL, HOW DOES IT WORK? COULD YOU GIVE US A GENERAL TIMETABLE WHEN THE DESIGNATION COULD GO INTO EFFECT? >> MAHALO NUI. MAHALO FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO RESPOND TO KOKUA ON THIS AND ANSWER QUESTIONS.\r\nAS FAR AS THE PROCESS, RIGHT NOW, WE'RE DOING OUR

HOMEWORK STILL, LIKE WE HAVEN'T ENTER THE FORMAL CHAPTER 91 PROCESS AND KIND OF LESSON-LEARNED IF YOU JUMP INTO THE CHAPTER 91 PROCESS, OH, THE PLAN AND THIS IS WHAT IT IS, PEOPLE ARE LIKE, OH, WE DON'T KNOW WHAT IS HAPPENING. WE DIDN'T HAVE A CHANCE TO GET INPUT. SO RIGHT NOW WE HAVE BEEN DOING OUR HOMEWORK AND HAVING INFORMAL MEETINGS. THE COMMUNITY HAS BEEN GOING OUT AND TALKING-STORIS WITH DIFFERENT FOLKS AND HAVING VIRTUAL PUBLIC SCOPING SESSIONS. AND SAYING HEY, THIS IS WHAT THE COMMUNITY IS THINKING. HERE IS WHAT THEY ARE PROPOSING. WHAT IS YOUR FEEDBACK?\r\n\r\nWE HAVE BEEN GETTING DIFFERENT FEEDBACK AND THE COMMUNITY AND DLNR HAS BEEN GETTING FEEDBACK AND WE START TO COMPILE THE FEEDBACK AND HERE IS HOW WE CAN MAYBE COMPROMISE? AND WHAT ARE THE AREAS WHERE PEOPLE SEEM TO HAVE ISSUES WITH AND LET'S TALK ABOUT THOSE THINGS. SO WE HAVE BEEN TALKING AND GETTING TO THE POINT, OKAY, WE THINK EVERYBODY IS ON-BOARD AND WE GOT AGREEMENT. WE HAVE A GOOD IDEA MOVING FORWARD. LET'S CAN BE THE NEXT STEP IS THE 291 SYSTEM AND WHAT WOULD HAPPEN, THE COMMUNITY IS WRAPPING UP FINALIZING THEIR MANAGEMENT PLAN. THEY ARE WRAPPING UP THEIR ADMINISTRATIVE RECORD. SO DOCUMENT ALL OF THE DIFFERENT MEETINGS THAT THEY HAVE, ALL THE DIFFERENT OUTREACH EVENTS AND HOW MANY PEOPLE CONTACTED AND SO HAVE A LIST, SO PEOPLE KNOW HERE ARE THE OPPORTUNITIES THAT WERE PROVIDED FOR YOU TO JUMP IN.\r\n\r\nIS THAT MY TWO MINUTES? >> I THINK THE QUESTION WAS WHAT IS THE DEADLINE? >> THE DEADLINE IS SO WE'RE LOOKING TO TAKE IT TO THE BOARD WHENEVER THE COMMUNITY IS FINISHED WITH THEIR HOMEWORK. SO ONCE THEIR MANAGEMENT PLAN IS FINALIZED AND SAY HEY, THIS IS WHAT WE'RE TURNING INTO DLNR. WE CAN SAY PERFECT. WE CAN TAKE THIS TO THE BOARD. SO WE'RE KIND OF WAITING FOR THEM TO WRAP IT UP.\r\n\r\nWHEN THEY'RE READY, WE CAN TAKE IT TO THE BOARD. SO HONESTLY WE COULD HAVE SOMETHING BEFORE THE BOARD IN OCTOBER PROBABLY, POSSIBLY. AND IT JUST DEPENDS WHEN THE COMMUNITY IS COMPLETED WITH THAT. THEY TURN IT INTO US. >> THANK YOU. MR. MOLINA, DO YOU HAVE ANY FOLLOW-UP QUESTIONS?\r\n\r\n>> NO, NOT AT THIS TIME. THANK YOU, CHAIR. >> MEMBERS, DO YOU HAVE QUESTIONS FOR MR. KEKUA. >> THANK YOU FOR BEING HERE, MR. KEKUA. THE BOARD OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES IS GOING TO MEET IN OCTOBER AND MY SENSE IS THAT THE ORGANIZATION WANTS TO TRY TO MEET THAT DEADLINE.\r\n\r\nWHEN IS THAT MEETING GOING TO OCCUR IN OCTOBER? >> THERE'S TWO DIFFERENT MEETINGS. I CAN LOOK AT -- THEY ARE USUALLY HELD IN THE FRIDAYS, SECOND AND FOURTH FRIDAYS, BUT I WILL GO AHEAD AND VERIFY THAT. >> MEMBER KAMA. >> THANK YOU. THANK YOU, CHAIR. >> OTHER QUESTIONS FOR MR.\r\n\r\nKEKUA? IF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH, MR. KEKUA. ANY FURTHER DISCUSSION ON THIS ITEM? VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ. >> MAHALO, CHAIR. AND MAHALO, MEMBER SINENCI AND TO THE KIPAHULU 'OHANA, AND EAST MAUI COMMUNITY FOR THEIR HARD WORK ON THIS.\r\n\r\nI AM IN STRONG SUPPORT OF PASSING THE RESOLUTION TODAY. I SEE THIS AS THE QUESTION THAT I'M ANSWERING IN MY VOTE IS DO I SUPPORT THE COMMUNITY IN THIS EFFORT OF HAVING A CBSFA DESIGNATION? AND I 100% SUPPORT THAT. THEY HAVE BEEN WORKING REALLY HARD TO ACCOMMODATE THOSE THAT HAVE BEEN EXPRESSING THEIR CONCERNS, AND ADJUSTING WHEN NECESSARY. I SEE THIS CBSFA LAW AS UPLIFTING THOSE WHO HAVE KULEANA TO MALAMA AND INSTEAD WHAT WE HAVE SEEN BEFORE IS LAWS PROTECTING THOSE WHO EXPLOITED THE RESOURCES THAT HAVE BEEN ABUNDANT BECAUSE OF THOSE WHO HAVE EXECUTED THEIR MALAMA TO -- THEIR KULEANA TO MALAMA THIS PLACE, SO THERE IS ABUNDANCE AND WHAT WE'RE SEEING IS NOT SO MUCH ABUNDANCE AND WHY THE CBSFA WAS CREATED. TECHNOLOGY HAS OUTPACED OUR SPECIES AND SEEING LESS BABIES ARE ABLE TO MAKE IT TO ADULTHOOD. IN TERMS OF SPEAKING IN TERMS OF CAPITALISM, THE ECOSERVICE SYSTEMS THAT THESE RESOURCES PROVIDE, IF PUT IN CASH TERMS,

THEY CREATE THE WHITE SAND BEACHES THAT TOURISTS WANT TO COME TO HAWAI'I TO ENJOY.\r\n\r\nTHEY ENSURE THAT REEFS ARE HEALTHY. SO THAT WE HAVE OXYGEN TO BREATHE, AND I DON'T KNOW HOW MUCH EACH LIFE IS WORTH? BUT OXYGEN IS VERY IMPORTANT FOR KEEPING US ALIVE. SO THAT RETURN ON INVESTMENT IS HARD TO QUANTIFY. THAT IS PART OF THIS. WITH -- WITH THE OPIHI REST AREA IS SO IMPORTANT, BECAUSE WHAT WE HAVE BEEN SEEING IS OVERHARVESTING. AND SO THE REST AREA WILL ALLOW FOR OTHER PLACES THAT HAVE BEEN OVERHARVESTED, THE ABILITY TO RETURN TO HAVE OPIHI.\r\n\r\nSO >> PLEASE CONCLUDE. >> I KNOW THE TWO MINUTES ARE UP. OTHERS HAVE HAD MORE THAN TWO MINUTES. I WILL WAIT UNTIL MY SECOND TURN TO ADD A LITTLE BIT MORE TO THIS. BECAUSE THERE'S SO MUCH TO SAY, AND AS MEMBER PALTIN POINTED OUT, THIS IS OVER 30 YEARS IN THE MAKING. SO I'M SUPER SUPPORTIVE OF THIS. MAHALO, CHAIR.\r\n\r\n>> MEMBER JOHNSON. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. I ALSO RISE IN FULL SUPPORT OF THIS RESOLUTION. I WANT TO TELL EVERYBODY KIND OF THE CONTEXT IN WHICH I LIVE ON THE ISLAND OF LANA'I. OWNED 98% BY A PRIVATE BILLIONAIRE AND ONE OF THE THINGS WE OFTEN HEAR, WE DON'T HAVE A SAY. AND CBSFAS ALLOWS COMMUNITIES A SAY IN WHAT HOW THEY MANAGE THEIR NATURAL RESOURCES. I WISH WE COULD DO A CBSFA THROUGHOUT THE STATE --THROUGHOUT THE ISLANDS, BECAUSE EVERY COMMUNITY HAS DIFFERENT NEEDS, AND EVERY REEF IS DIFFERENT. YOU KNOW, THE REEF ON LANA'I DOES NOT HAVE THE PROTECTIONS THAT THE STATE HAS GIVEN THEM TO THE UHU THAT COUNCIL MEMBER KEANI RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ WAS JUST SPEAKING OF.\r\n\r\nOUR UHU ARE UNPROTECTED. SO THAT CBSFA SHOULD BE EXPANDED, AND I WORKED ON A CBSFA ON THE ISLAND OF LANA'I FIVE YEARS AGO. WHEN THEY SAY IT TAKES TEN YEARS, THAT IS ABOUT HOW LONG IT TAKES, AND THAT IS IF PEOPLE ARE REALLY MOTIVATED TO GO THROUGH THE RED TAPE TO CREATE A CBSFA IS A MASSIVE UNDERTAKING. SO I COMMEND THOSE FOLKS THAT HAVE DONE IT. IT'S NOT EASY. IF THEY ARE WILLING TO DO ALL OF THAT WORK, LEAST WE CAN DO IS SUPPORT THIS RESOLUTION. THANK YOU, CHAIR.\r\n\r\n>> FURTHER DISCUSSION? ANYBODY WHO WOULD LIKE TO SPEAK FOR THE FIRST TIME? MEMBER PALTIN, DIDN'T YOU SPEAK ALREADY? >> I DID, CHAIR. I WAS JUST -- >> LET'S CHECK IF ANYBODY ELSE WANTS TO SPEAK FOR THE FIRST TIME. MEMBER KING. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR.\r\n|r\nI JUST WANTED TO SPEAK IN SUPPORT OF THE MOTION. I DO THINK PRETTY MUCH EVERYBODY HAS MADE ALL OF THE POINTS THAT NEEDED TO BE MADE. I APPRECIATE THAT DLNR WILL BE REACHING OUT AGAIN TO THE PUBLIC IN ITS PROCEEDINGS BEYOND WHAT WE'RE DOING TODAY. EVEN THOUGH IT'S THE FIRST TIME I HAVE HEARD OF THIS CBSFA, IT'S NOT THE FIRST TIME I HAVE HEARD OF THIS CONCEPT, OR THE ATTEMPTS FOR THIS AND, IN FACT IT WAS ONE THING DISCUSSED IN THE MOLOKA'I COMMUNITY PLANS, AS MEMBER RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ MEMBERS. THERE WAS QUITE A DISCUSSION AND WE ENDED UP PUTTING THE INTENT IN THERE, BUT NOT THE ACTUAL SUPPORT FOR IT. SO I THINK THIS IS GOING TO HELP OTHER AREAS OF OUR COMMUNITY FOLLOWING SUIT, UNDERSTAND WHAT COMMUNITY STEWARDSHIP MEANS, YOU KNOW, SUBSISTENCE FISHING IS? AND I THINK WE SHOULD SUPPORT IT.\r\n\r\nI WON'T TAKE UP TOO MUCH MORE TIME. THANK YOU. >> ANYONE ELSE FOR THE FIRST TIME? MEMBER SUGIMURA. >> THANK YOU VERY MUCH MR. SINENCI, FOR BRINGING THIS FORWARD, AND THE COMMUNITY. I ALWAYS HAVE TO SAY WHEN I SEE SCOTT CRAWFORD TESTIFY, I MEAN, HE IS ALWAYS AT THE LEAD OF PULLING LOTS TOGETHER, BESIDES THE LYNN FAMILY.\r\n\r\nTHERE'S BEEN REALLY -- I DON'T KNOW IF YOU CAN REALLY CALL IT MOVERS AND SHAKERS, BUT IT SORT OF IS THOSE THAT HAVE COME FORWARD, I FULLY RESPECT THEM. I SUPPORT THIS, AND SO THE MANAGEMENT PLAN IS READY TO GO IS WHAT WE'RE HEARING AND DLNR WILL HEAR THIS OR PUT IT ON THE AGENDA THEN IN OCTOBER. IS THAT CORRECT? MR. KEKUA? >> HE DID SAY THEY ARE WORKING FOR THE OCTOBER DEADLINE. >> THE PLAN IS READY TO GO, AND

IT'S JUST A MATTER OF IF WE APPROVE THIS, IT WILL GO ON THE AGENDA FOR DLNR.\r\n\T\HAS TO BE REQUESTED. IT HAS TO GO -- SOMEBODY? YES? >> YES. >> THUMB'S UP FROM MR. SINENCI. >> MR.\r\n\r\nSINENCI. >> THANK YOU. >> ANYBODY ELSE? SECOND ROUND. MEMBER PALTIN. ONE MINUTE. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR.\r\n\r\nTHIS JOB IS NOT ALWAYS THE FUNNEST. SO VERY GRATEFUL TO MEMBER SINENCI FOR BRINGING FORWARD THIS. >> YOU'RE BREAKING UP. YOU'RE BREAKING UP. >> HOW ABOUT NOW? >> OKAY, BETTER. >> OKAY.\r\n\r\nSTILL GOOD? >> YES, STILL GOOD. >> OKAY. CAN I START OVER? >> CERTAINLY. >> THANK YOU. I JUST IN ALL HONESTY, THIS ISN'T ALL THE FUNNEST JOB AND I'M SO GRATEFUL TO MR.\r\n\r\nSINENCI AND KIPAHULU COMMUNITY AND IN LOVING MEMORY OF UNCLE JOHN LYNN. YOU KNOW, THIS IS ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT REASONS TO BE HERE TO BE ABLE TO VOTE ON THIS TODAY, BECAUSE IT SUPPORTS COMMUNITIES AND COMMUNITY-BASED MANAGEMENT. IF WE COULD DO EVERYTHING WITH ALL OF THE INPUT FROM THE COMMUNITY, I KNOW IT'S MESSY A LOT OF TIMES, BUT IT'S WORTH IT. THANK YOU, MEMBER SINENCI AND TO THE KIPAHULU 'OHANA AND ALL OUT THERE. >> THANK YOU. ANYBODY ELSE? READY FOR THE VOTE?\r\nPRO TEM KAMA AND VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. I JUST WANTED TO SAY THAT YOU KNOW, IN MY YOUTH, WHEN I WAS STILL YOUNG AND NOT SO SMART, I ALWAYS THOUGHT THAT THE NATIVE PEOPLE HAD IT RIGHT THEN. THEN I GOT AN AMERICAN EDUCATION AND I THOUGHT SOMETHING ELSE. BUT HERE WE ARE TODAY, MANY YEARS, AND DECADES LATER, I STILL KNOW THAT THE NATIVE PEOPLE HAD IT RIGHT. SO WHAT WE'RE TRYING TO DO TODAY IS TO GET THINGS BACK TO WHERE IT SHOULD HAVE BEEN WITHOUT ALL OF THE INTERRUPTIONS THAT HAPPENED BETWEEN 1778, AND TODAY. SO I THINK WE'RE JUST TRYING TO RIGHT THINGS RIGHT SIDE UP, BECAUSE THEY HAVE BEEN UPSIDE DOWN FOR A LONG TIME.\r\n\r\nSO I'M JUST TOTALLY STOKED ABOUT THIS, AND I'M READY TO VOTE IN SUPPORT OF THIS. THANK YOU, CHAIR. >> THANK YOU. VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ. >> MAHALO, CHAIR. ALOHA, PRO TEM KAMA. YES, EXACTLY.\r\n\r\nTHAT IS EXACTLY IT. BEFORE THE INTRODUCTION OF CAPITALISTIC SYSTEM WE HAD 'OHANA SYSTEM AND COMMODIFICATION OF THE ESSENTIAL LIFE GIVING THINGS, AND OUR SHELTER, FOR EXAMPLE. IT'S COMMODIFIED IT AND COMMODIFIED OUR NATURE RESOURCES AND THERE'S LESS OF IT, INSTEAD OF WORKING TOWARDS ABUNDANCE OF AHUPUA'A MANAGEMENT. I JUST WANTED TO ADD THAT I HOPE THAT THIS IS PASSED THROUGH THE CHAPTER 91 RULE-MAKING PROCESS, WHICH IS COMPLETELY PUBLIC, AND CAN BE REALLY LONG AND RIGOROUS. I HOPE THIS GETS THROUGH BEFORE OTHER KUPUNA PASS. IT'S HEARTBREAKING WHEN IT DOESN'T GET COMPLETED IN THEIR LIFETIME. MAHALO TO THE COMMUNITY.\r\n\r\nMAHALO, CHAIR. >> ANYBODY ELSE? MEMBER SINENCI? >> MAHALO, CHAIR. MAHALO NUI TO ALL THE TESTIFIERS WHO CAME OUT IN SUPPORT. MAHALO. I ASK FOR THE MEMBERS' SUPPORT.\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU. >> ANYONE ELSE? READY FOR THE VOTE? WE DON'T SEE A PROBLEM WITH THE PROCEDURE, AS LONG AS THE COUNTY CLERK FEELS THAT THEY HAVE EVERYTHING THAT THEY NEED TO DOCUMENT THE ACTIONS FOR THE RECORD, AND THE MEETING MINUTES. THANK YOU, CHAIR. >> THANK YOU, MR.
