Recommending REFERRAL of communications to the Council Chair for the term beginning on January 2, 2023, relating to: (1) health of Maui County farmers; (2) Lanai Water Advisory Committee; (3) acquisition of real property from the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands for the Mahinahina Water Treatment Facility; (4) Department of Water Supply Strategic Plan, Phase II (Contract WC1027, Harris and Associates Inc.); (5) sustainability and restoration of traditional Hawaiian fishponds; (6) watershed management and protection; (7) Hawaiian cultural restoration; (8) additional water fixtures for commercial farm property; (9) important agricultural lands; (10) wellhead protection overlay district; (11) access through the Hans Michel property for maintenance and operation of Kanaha Valley Stream; (12) EMI water delivery agreement; (13) County Archaeologist; (14) Upcountry reservoirs; (15) food security for Maui County; (16) operational and budgetary review of the Department of Water Supply; (17) Lanai Agricultural Park lease; (18) African tulip tree; (19) protection of historic properties; (20) impacts of activities by imperium companies and affiliates in East Maui; (21) Kula Agricultural Park; (22) important agricultural lands incentives and mapping report (Contract C7126, Christine M. Feinholz dba Pacific Cartography); (23) Maui Invasive Species Committee (MISC); (24) telecommunications regulations; (25) Bill 17 (2022), private restrictions on small-scale agricultural uses and the keeping of animals; (26) Old Hana School improvements (Contract C7547, F&H Construction); (27) adding sustainable agriculture and climate change solutions to the Maui County General Plan objectives; (28) composting; (29) water delivery systems; (30) Bill 53 (2022), creating the Feral Animal Management Fund; (31) Bill 55 (2022), administrative rules for the Molokai Farming Cost Reimbursement Program Fund; (32) Bill 79 (2022), exemptions for agricultural water consumers from restrictions or mandates during water shortages; (33) Bill 83 (2022), water rates for agricultural consumers on lots with no dwellings; and (34) Bill 104 (2022), notice to property owners and lessees when an account is in arrears.
