The Committee is in receipt of County Communication 19-397, from the Chair, Board of Ethics, and the Department of the Corporation Counsel, transmitting a proposed resolution entitled "AUTHORIZING THE RETENTION OF SPECIAL COUNSEL FROM THE OFFICE OF THE CORPORATION COUNSEL, COUNTY OF HAWAII TO ADVISE THE MAUI COUNTY BOARD OF ETHICS IN THE MATTER OF COMPLAINT NO. 19-05 ALLEGING VIOLATIONS OF THE MAUI COUNTY CODE OF ETHICS, BY OFFICER AND EMPLOYEES OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI."
