The Committee is in receipt of the following:

1. Correspondence dated October 16, 2019, from the Department of the Corporation Counsel, requesting consideration of a proposed resolution to authorize settlement of Robert G. Straub v. County of Maui and Teena Rasmussen, USDC, Civil 17-00516 JMS-RLP, and transmitting a copy of the First Amended Complaint. The First Amended Complaint alleges Family Medical Leave Act ("FMLA") interference, FMLA retaliation, Americans with Disabilities Act association discrimination, and age discrimination against Plaintiff Robert G. Straub.
2. Correspondence dated October 29, 2019, from the Department of the Corporation Counsel, transmitting a revised proposed resolution entitled "AUTHORIZING SETTLEMENT OF ROBERT G. STRAUB v. COUNTY OF MAUI AND TEENA RASMUSSEN, USDC, CIVIL NO. 17-00516 JMS-RLP." The purpose of the revised proposed resolution is to authorize settlement of the case.

The Committee may consider whether to recommend adoption of the revised proposed resolution, with or without further revisions. The Committee may also consider the filing of the correspondence and other related action.
