The Committee is in receipt of the following:

1. Resolution 23-32, entitled "AUTHORIZING SETTLEMENT OF GREGORY CROWTON V. COUNTY OF MAUI, DISABILITY COMPENSATION DIVISION CASE NO. 7-16-00279." Resolution 23-32's purpose is to authorize settlement of the claim, filed on January 23, 2016. The Workers' Compensation Claim alleges work related injuries sustained on January 11, 2016.
